SUGGESTIONS WHEN CALLING OR WRITING

- Be polite and respectful remember to treat others the way you want to be treated.
- Be accurate and concise Handle the facts with integrity and brevity. Don't exaggerate or guess. If possible have a least one other person proofread your letter for content, style, grammar, spelling, etc.
- Be Biblical- It is appropriate to express a Biblical viewpoint, but don't be too lengthy. Avoid theological roadblocks by not naming a particular church or denomination.
- Be positive Avoid writing from a "doom-and-gloom" perspective. Make an appeal, then trust God for the results.
- Be specific Clearly state what action you want.

Creamy Fettuccine Alfredo

1 cup (2 sticks) butter, softened 2 cups whipping cream

2 cups grated Parmesan cheese 1/8 tsp. salt 1 box (1 lb.) fettuccine

1/8 tsp. black pepper

Fresh basil leaves

Place the butter in a large heatproof bowl. Using a wooden spoon or an electric mixer set on low speed, beat until smooth. Add the cream and Parmesan cheese. Stir until well blended; set aside.

Bring a large saucepan of lightly salted water to a boil. Add the pasta and cook according to package directions. Drain well and immediately add the hot pasta to the butter mixture in the large bowl. Using two forks, toss the fettuccine in the butter mixture to coat well. Add the salt and pepper.

Divide the pasta between 4 serving plates. Quickly slice the basil into shreds to equal 1/4 cup. Sprinkle shredded basil over each serving. Serve immediately.

From our Pastor's Wife ... Mrs. Vida Collingsworth **Teaching Children**

Obviously there is a time for a child to be content with a toy rattle. However, too many put off training a child in spiritual things.

As soon as a child can sing nursery rhymes, they should be encouraged to sing hymns by parents pointing in the song book to the words being

sung.

Children can be taught very early to bow their head and pray and recognize they are talking to God. The same can be said for reading the Bible. This is important long before the child can ever read.

The greatest opportunity for teaching is by example. Your daily walk with God will influence your child to a greater degree than just words alone.

Then there is teaching by exhortation. Give your child Biblical explanations and practical applications of truth. Teach your children about the things you have seen (Ex. 10:2, Deu. 4:9). Teach them about God's revelation of power in history (Ps. 71:18, Ps. 145:4).

Giving a child a clear understanding of truth and the reason as to why God does things will create in the child an awe, wonder, reverence, and adoration for God.

"THE PASTOR"

"He (Jesus) gave some apostles; and some prophets; and some evangelists; and some PASTORS AND TEACHERS." (Ephesians 4:11)

Note that the word "some" is not found between "PASTORS" and "teachers." The pastor is to be a teacher as well as a preacher. The verses that follow in *Ephesians 4* reveal that the pastor was given by the Lord to ground the saints doctrinally and nurture them into maturity. It is he who speaks unto the church the Word of God.

"Remember them which have the rule over you, who have SPOKEN unto you the WORD OF GOD." (Heb. 13:7)

It is the pastor who speaks the Word of God to the people and who is responsible to God for watching over their souls.

"Obey them that have the rule over you and submit yourselves: FOR THEY WATCH FOR YOUR SOULS." (Heb. 13:17)

God never appointed a "board" of elders or deacons to speak the Word of God. He never appointed a board of ANY kind to watch over the souls of the people

Let us back-track a moment and notice something else that was said in Hebrews 13:7 and 17.

"Remember them WHICH HAVE RULE OVER YOU."

"Obey them that HAVE THE RULE OVER YOU."

The pastor is the RULER in the church. Some church members will gnash on me with their teeth, foam at the mouth and throw themselves on the floor in a rage ... but IT'S THE TRUTH! The pastor is God's RULER in the church. All right, hear it again:

"Let the elders (pastors) that RÜLE WELL be counted worthy of double honour." (I Tim. 5.17)
"We beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you and ARE OVER YOU IN THE
LORD and admonish you . . . to esteem them very highly. (I Thess. 5:12-13)

God's man in the church is the pastor. He is the one that RULES over you in the Lord. The pastor is the overseer. The overseer is the bishop. The bishop is the elder, and the elder is the pastor.

Restoring Modesty

Many of the problems we hear about today—sexual harassment, date rape, young women who suffer from eating disorders and report feeling a lack of control over their bodies—are all connected, I believe, to our culture's attack on modesty. Listen, first, to the words we use to describe intimacy: what was once called, "making love," and then, "having sex," is now, "hooking up," like airplanes refueling in flight.

Since the 1960's... men have grown to expect women to be casual about sex, and women for their part, don't feel they have the right to say "no." This has brought us all more misery than joy. On MTV I have seen a 27-year-old woman say she was "sort of glad" she had herpes, because now she has an "excuse to say 'no' to sex." For her, disease has replaced modesty as the justification for exercising free choice.

When I talk to college students, invariably one will say, "Well, if you want to be modest, be modest. If you want to be promiscuous, be promiscuous. We all have a choice,

and that's the wonderful thing about this society." But the culture, I tell them, cannot be neutral. Nor is it subtle in it's influence on behavior. In fact, culture works more like a Sherman tank. In the end, if it's not going to value modesty, it will value promiscuity and adultery, and all our lives and marriages will suffer.

The myth I want to touch on is that modesty is solely a concern for women. We are where we are today only in part because the feminine ideal has changed. The masculine ideal has followed suit. It was once looked on as manly to be faithful to one woman for life, and to be protective toward all women. Sadly, this is no longer the case, even among many men to whom modest women look as kindred spirits. Modern feminists are wrong to expect men to be gentlemen when they themselves are not ladies, but men who value "scoring" and then lament that there are no modest women around anymore—well, they are just as bad.

Lest We Forget—General George S. Patton



Nearly 70 years after Gen. George S. Patton's death, he remains one of America's most popular military figures. Why? The answer is simple: Patton was a winner who knew how to convince his soldiers that they were winners too.

The Germans tested Patton's leadership early in his World War II command. He had taken over the U.S. Army's II Corps after its disastrous performance at the Battle of the Kasserine Pass in February 1943. He was in charge less than a month when the Deutsches Afrika Korps challenged his command at El Guettar. Patton's soldiers whipped the

panzers, and it was the U.S. Army's first major victory against the German Army in Europe.

Patton's success continued. During the summer of 1943, leading the Seventh Army during the invasion of Sicily, his soldiers captured or killed more than 13,000 enemy soldiers while sustaining a fraction of those casualties in return. After Sicily, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower appointed Patton to lead the Third Army in northwest Europe.

On Aug. 1,1944, Patton's Third Army rocketed out of Normandy and raced across France in record time, crippling the German Army. In late September, his divisions crushed the German Fifth Panzer Army at the Battle of Arracourt. In December, while the rest of the Allied armies reeled from the Battle of the Bulge, the Third Army was counterattacking. Asked how long it would take his soldiers to relieve Bastogne, Patton promised that his men would be ready to move in less than 48 hours. Senior leaders scoffed, but he proved them wrong, and his men relieved the 101st Airborne the day after Christmas.

Everywhere Patton went, he won. The men who served under him loved him, while his enemies respected and feared him. After the war, many German generals claimed he was the best Allied general. They were right.
