MAY FLOWERS

2:3, “... *the apple tree among the trees ...*”
2:12, “... *the flowers appear on the earth: the time of the singing of the birds has come...*”

What a beautiful portrait of our Saviour!

The Rose—a symbol of love. The Lily—a symbol of purity. The Apple Blossom—a symbol of beauty and sweetness.

Have you ever been in an apple orchard when The Apple Blossoms have bloomed? The sweetness and beauty will overwhelm you.

Notice 2:12, “... *flowers ... singing ...*” That’s joy!

Love, purity, sweetness, and joy! Flowers in the spring, new life!

SECOND: THE PROMINENCE OF THE FLOWER. SONG OF SOLOMON 5:9

“*What is thy beloved more than another?*”

A More Sure Word

II Peter 1:12-21

Consider the account of (the rich man and Lazarus. Lazarus was a beggar who sat at the rich man's table begging for the crumbs that would fall. Both the rich man and Lazarus died. In Hell the rich man lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham with Lazarus. The rich man cried out to God in *Luke 16:27-31*, "...I pray thee therefore, father that thou wouldest send him to my fathers house: For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; [Genesis-Deuteronomy and the books written by the prophets] let them hear them. And he said, Nay, father Abraham: hit if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. And he said unto him, if they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rose from the dead."

Someone should tell Oral Roberts about those verses. There is more power in preaching the Bible than in the healing of cancer or in making the cripple to walk. There is more power in preaching God's Word, Moses and the prophets is all that the people in Luke 16 had. Today's Christians now have all of God's Word, the total revelation. The Bible is better than a healing service. It is better than a so-called miracle-working services.

If I had my choice between preaching the Bible next Sunday morning or going to the cemetery to raise somebody from the dead and letting him tell people what he had seen. I'd leave that person in the grave, so I could preach the Book! The answer is in the Book. The answer is not in somebody's testimony, The answer is in the Book. The answer is not in somebody's miracle, The answer is in God's Word!

Abraham said that the Bible is more powerful than the testimony of a person raised from the dead. Peter, was somebody who had the power of God, yet Peter said the Bible is more powerful than the testimony of someone who saw Jesus on earth, who heard the voice of God as Jesus was baptized, who heard the voice of God on the mount of transfiguration, and who saw and talked to Moses and Elijah. Peter said God's Word will do more to get people saved and has more power than all those events put together.

Lemon Dutch Pancakes

1 cup unbleached all-purpose flour	Seeds from 4 to 5 green cardamom pods (about 1/4 teaspoon seeds)	1/2 stick unsalted butter
1 tbsp. granulated sugar	1 cup whole milk	1/4 cup confectioners' sugar
Generous pinch of kosher salt	1 tbsp. finely grated lemon zest	2 tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice
4 eggs		

- Preheat the oven to 425°F, and place a rack in the middle of the oven.
- In a small bowl, stir together the flour, granulated sugar, and salt. Finely grind the cardamom seeds using a mortar and pestle or a clean coffee grinder, and add them to the dry ingredients. Set aside.
- In a large bowl, lightly whisk the eggs with the milk and zest. Add the dry ingredients, and lightly whisk until blended. The batter doesn't have to be completely smooth, but make sure there aren't any large lumps of flour.
- In a medium (10-inch) cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat melt the butter, swirling the pan occasionally, until the butter is very hot and foamy, and almost beginning to brown. Immediately pour in the batter, and put the skillet in the oven.
- Bake for 20 minutes, or until the edges are billowy and brown and the center of the pancake has puffed up. Remove the pan from the oven, sprinkle the pancake evenly with the confectioners' sugar, and return it to the oven for 2 to 3 more minutes. Sprinkle the lemon juice over the top, and serve immediately.

THIRD: THE POWER OF THEIR INFLUENCE.**MATTHEW 6:28**

Through the years I have seen young men give flowers to some young lady, and a sweet smile would appear up on her face. In my own life, I could not tell you how many times I have brought a flower home to my wife, and have that gift be followed by a tear and a sweet gentle kiss, usually followed by, "I love you so much."

If a simple flower can have that much influence upon your heart, then how much more should the sweetness of Christ influence your heart?

John 21:17, "Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee."

There is no place on this earth that you can hide the influence of the flower. You can flee, as Jonah did, but the influence of our Saviour will already be there.

Someone said, "I disagree. There are no flowers in the desert." Oh no, you are wrong. I can take you to the desert of Arizona and show you the flower on The Saguaro Cactus. Or to the plains of Nebraska and show you the beautiful Goldenrod. Or to the great state of Tennessee and show you the Iris. Or the vast state of Texas and show you the Bluebonnet. Yes, the influence of the flower can be seen everywhere. And you will find that no matter where you go, God was already there. By the way, The White Carnation pictures mother as a pure, soft, and sweet influence in the home.

Conclusion: Just as April showers bring forth May flowers, the water of God's Word must be poured upon the heart in order to soften the soil of the human heart. That's where the child of God comes into the picture. We are to make sure that the seeds are planted. **Luke 8:11, "The seed is the word of God."**

Christian, may it be said of each of us that we have been with Christ so much that His sweet fragrance and influence can be felt by all those we meet.

Have you ever walked up to someone that worked in a flower shop? The fragrance of the flowers will linger on them. May it be so with our relationship with Christ.

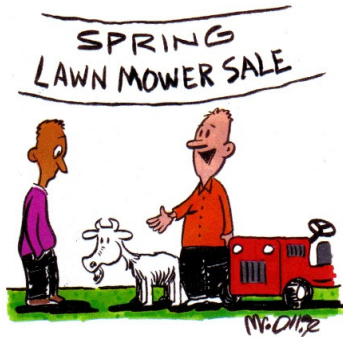

White House Again Refuses to Call ISIS' Slaughter of Christians "Genocide"

White House Press Secretary Josh Earnest declined to call the Islamic State's persecution of Christians in Iraq and Syria a "genocide/" saying earlier.. .that such a distinction requires a "specific legal determination" that has "not been reached."

During a press briefing,...Earnest was questioned by a reporter on whether the Islamic State is "carrying out a campaign of genocide against Syria's Christians." Earnest initially responded by failing to address the "genocide" question and answered by saying that the Obama administration has "long expressed" concerns with the "tactic" used by ISIS to "slaughter religious minorities."...

After saying that IS' atrocious treatment of religious minorities is an affront to American values, Earnest was again asked to address whether or not IS' persecution of Christians should be considered a "genocide."

"My understanding is that the use of that word involves a very specific legal determination that has, at this point, not been reached," Earnest said....

A spending bill passed by Congress in December gave the State Department 90 days to make a distinction on whether or not the United States will call IS' treatment of religious minorities a "genocide." The Obama administration has consistently sided with Muslims against Christians.

Lest We Forget—A Proper Goodbye

By all accounts, Jimmie Collins and Welborn Smith were all-American boys who left their small hometowns to defeat Hitler and Nazi Germany.

Collins was valedictorian, a star athlete and popular at Lowndes County High School in Fort Deposit, Ala. He realized his dream of becoming an Army pilot and flying missions in the European theater. Smith, who grew up in Roberta, Ga., was the third of five boys and so well-liked that everyone understood he was "mother's favorite." He followed his two older brothers into the service, choosing the Army Air Forces.

Their paths crossed when they were assigned to the 446th Bombardment Group, 20th

Combat Wing, 2nd Bomb Division. Second Lt. Collins was the co-pilot, while Staff

Sgt. Smith served as the engineer and gunner of their B-24 Liberator, *Connie*. [*Connie* was the name they gave their aircraft.]

In the last known photo of the two men, Smith is standing behind Collins, along with eight other crew members in front of the plane. It is perhaps fitting that Smith is looking over Collins, as their fates and families became linked decades after the Germans shot down *Connie* over the Netherlands on June 21, 1944. All but one crew member was killed.

On June 29, 2015 - 71 years and eight days after *Connie* was shot down - Jimmie Collins was laid to rest with full military honors. American Legion Post 45 of Sylacauga performed honor guard duties.

"Aunt Mary would be very happy that he had been found," Mary Brooks says. "She was very proud of him because he wanted to serve his country and sacrificed his life for us." The Collins family invited Bob Lee Smith, Welborn's brother, to the funeral. Taps was sounded, memories were shared, and thanks were given on a day the Collins family doubted would ever come. Jimmie was buried next to his mother.

At the close of the funeral, Smith paused at the flag-draped casket, gazed down and whispered to Collins, "You're home."
