No! God chose a man who was a builder. A man who had rough hands and a brow exhausted by the heat of the sun. He chose a carpenter.

SECOND: THE GUARDIAN OF CHRISTMAS WAS MORALLY CLEAN.

MAII. 1:18

"When his mother Mary was espoused to Joseph, before they came together ..."

What does this mean? The betrothal period of the Jewish families was a time of testing. It was also time for the groom to prepare a home for his bride. During the time of betrothal there was absolutely no improper touching, and absolutely no sexual contact at all.

"O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken."—Luke 24:25. The Bible is infallibly correct. It is correct in science. It is accurate in history and in every other matter discussed.

Blueberry Dessert Bars

1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter

1 cup firmly packed brown sugar

1 cup granulated sugar

1 large egg, room temperature

2 tsp. pure vanilla extract

3 cups all-purpose flour 2 cups old-fashioned rolled oats

1/4 cup granulated sugar

1 tsp. kosher salt 1 tsp. baking powder 3 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

3 tbsp. freshly squeezed lemon juice

3 tbsp. instant tapioca

Preheat the oven to 350 F. Spray a 9 x 13-inch baking dish with cooking spray, or brush with butter. In the bowl of a stand mixer, or in a large bowl using an electric hand mixer, cream together the butter,

brown sugar, and granulated sugar. Add the egg and vanilla and combine. Stir in the flour, oats, salt, and baking powder until incorporated. In a medium bowl, stir together the blueberries, lemon juice, sugar, and tapioca and set aside.

Press half of the crumble mixture into the bottom of the prepared pan. Spread the blueberry mixture evenly over the crust. Gently crumble the remaining crust mixture over the blueberries. Bake for 45-50 minutes, until lightly golden brown. Cool completely before cutting into bars.
