ALONE

Introduction: Long before there ever was a reformation under the leadership of Martin Luther, there was a remnant of people called Baptist. They held to certain believes that they were willing to die for. There is something I would like to make clear: I am not a follower or admirer of Martin Luther. For a man to have started a religious revolution, he had some strange beliefs.

I. <u>He held to baptizing babies by sprinkling.</u> There is nothing like that in the Bible. *Acts* 8:38-39

II. <u>He was often drunk.</u> Luther said, "Whoever drinks beer, he is quick to sleep. Who sleeps long does not sin. Who does not sin enters Heaven.

Thus, let us drink beer!" Yes, Martin Luther said and believed that!

III. <u>He hated the Jews.</u> "What shall we do with the Jews? We should set fire to their synagogues and schools and cover with dirt whatever will not burn."

IV. He hated the Baptists. "The Baptist should be drown in their own baptismal pools."

Both the Catholics and Lutheran reformation movement were responsible for nearly wiping the Baptist from world history. They destroyed Baptist writings, churches and preachers. Over 80% of all martyrs in England were Anabaptist, meaning those that rebaptized those who had already been baptized as babies. The Baptist believed that you had to understand your relationship with Christ before you were baptized by immersion.

Under Bloody Mary there were 300 Baptist murdered in one location in one day. The Baptist believed they were alone in their stand, and 'Alone' became their battle cry.

FIRST: 'SOLA GRATIA' (BY GRACE ALONE.) EPHESIANS 2:8-9

Latin was used for almost all religious terms during the days of Martin Luther. That's why the battle cries of the Baptist were lifted up in Latin. The Baptist, "Anabaptist", believed that God saves, sustains, and strengthens His people by grace and grace alone.

SECOND: 'SOLA FIDE' (BY FAITH ALONE.) ROMANS 5:1–2

Both the Catholics and Lutherans thought that faith was essential, but that faith in Christ alone could not save. They believed you had to keep doing in order to stay saved. *Hebrews* 11:6, "But without faith it is impossible to please God..."

THIRD: 'SOLA SCRIPTURA' (BY SCRIPTURE ALONE.) I PETER 1:23


The Baptist believed that the "Final Authority" was in the Scriptures alone. But the other religions taught that the church's traditions and teachings were just as authoritative.

FOURTH: 'SOLUS CHRISTUS' (BY CHRIST ALONE.) JOHN 14:6

Most religions taught that there was more than one way to get to Heaven, but the Baptist taught that salvation was only through Christ. Acts 4:12, "Neither is their salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved."



From our Pastor's Wife ... Mrs. Vida Collingsworth "Learning the Pastor's Heart"

This article is perhaps the most needed article in every church because I believe one of the hardest things for a church to learn is the pastor's heart. Too often the majority of people only view the pastor as he stands behind the pulpit. They do not see his long hours in prayer and sermon preparation or the tears he sheds over those who are lost or backslidden; nor do they see the many who come to share their burdens and see his many

hours of sleeplessness because their burdens then become his.

The Bible tells us that a pastor is to reprove, rebuke and exhort (*II Timothy 4:2*). A pastor who truly loves his people will make sure they get a well-balanced diet when it comes to preaching, but many times the people do not understand nor do they see the pastor's own anguish at having to rebuke and correct the people. It is a job that pastors do not like to do, but if they truly love their people, they must!

A pastor's job is to oversee the work of the church's many ministries. He cannot possibly do them all, nor is he supposed to, for this is not God's plan. It is God's plan to have people to do the work of the ministry and for the pastor to oversee or supervise that work. The pastor looks to the deacons, Sunday School teachers, and anyone else that holds a position, to be in unity and in communication with him. Too often this is where a church fails the test. We put the cart before the horse and go tell the pastor what we're going to do rather than seeking the pastor's opinion and then following his spiritual judgment. Lip service alone is not good enough, for God knows our hearts. We must truly put this Biblical truth into practice. When we do not apply this principal, we may find that the pastor may seem to be demanding, but he is actually trying to get us on track and follow God's Word.

We are brainwashed by the world to do "our own thing" or, as the song says, "I did it my way", but this is not God's way. To be led by the Holy Spirit means to be led by God's Word. The Holy Spirit would not contradict His Word. If we truly want to be spiritual, we must apply God's Word in this matter of following the Pastor's leadership. Lest We Forget



In January 1969, 1st Lt. Diane Carlson is transferred to the 71st Evac Hospital at Pleiku, near the Cambodia border. "Now I am in the thick of combat. Our hospital is surrounded by concertina wire. We have four guard towers. It's very dangerous. We have sappers trying to get in. Patients were coming in so fast we called it a



'push.' A push meant mass casualties."

The 71st Evac nurses could be summoned instantly, any time of day or night, by a push. "Our hooches, where the nurses lived, were right next to the hospital. So in seconds, we could get on our boots, jungle fatigues, flak jacket and helmet when the red-alert siren went on.

"If one chopper was coming in, maybe up to eight patients, or if they really threw bodies on top of bodies, maybe 16. But, you know, one chopper was limited. Two choppers, three choppers -I used to call it a gaggle - you got tuned into the sound of those Hueys coming in, and to this day, if a Huey flew over, I would hear it from a mile away, maybe two miles away. When a bunch of choppers came in, you knew it was trouble."

(Years later, when sculptor Glenna Goodacre designed a female figure for the Vietnam Women's Memorial looking up as if for a helicopter, "we knew exactly what it meant. For the soldiers, the Dust Offair ambulance - helicopter meant hope. For us, it meant adrenaline-pumping work to save lives, and every minute counted.")

Every minute was spent on the edge of an emergency. "I don't think I ever really slept in Vietnam. I think I was always on the verge of sleep, waiting for that call and choppers flying."

In July 1969, 1st Lt. Carlson's tour in Vietnam ends. She doesn't want to go. "Just when we got good at what we were doing, we left. Same with the guys, the infantrymen, the soldiers. We turned it over to new people. I thought about staying another year, by re-upping, but I knew I needed to go home. I was losing weight. I was exhausted. I needed to rest."

She remembers vividly, as if it was only yesterday, her last patient in Pleiku. The most critically ill were positioned across from the nurses' station so they could keep a constant watch on them. "This patient was on a ventilator with a tracheostomy tube and couldn't speak."

To communicate, they wrote notes to each other. "I told him I was leaving. He became agitated. He didn't want me to leave. I was his nurse. He had become very attached to me. He wrote me a note that said, 'Don't leave me.' I know he was afraid. I think he knew he was going to die, and he didn't want to die alone.
