Lest We Forget

My body responded before my brain had time to process what was happening. As the mortar round, exploding shell, or machine gun blast—whatever it was, I'll never know—ripped into my body, I recoiled, lifted off the ground a bit, twisted in the air, and fell face down in the dirt.

For a long moment, I didn't know if I was dead or alive. I sensed the dirt in my mouth more than I

tasted it. I wanted to get up, to lift my face off the ground, to spit the dirt and blood out of my mouth, but I couldn't move. I lay facedown in the dirt, unable to feel my arms. Then the horror hit me—I can't feel anything below my neck! I didn't know it at the time, but whatever it was that hit me had ripped apart my shoulder, breaking my collarbone and my right arm. **Conclusion:** In 1935, truth serum was invented. The proper name is sodium pentothal. In World War II, sodium pentothal was used to obtain truthful information. It was mostly used by intelligence gathering organizations to accumulate the most accurate information possible from captured agents. What is so interesting is that while under the influence of truth serum, the patient did not lose self control. He or she actually did not tell the truth unless deep inside they wanted to tell the truth. Determining the truth was actually dependent upon the willingness of the one injected. New Year's Resolutions

Let me earnestly suggest some New Year's resolutions, some changes in your life that very possibly ought to be made now, early in the new year.

1. Do you read the Bible every day? How much of it do you read? Have you ever read it through? You may read the Bible through in less than a year by reading one chapter each day in the New Testament or the Psalms, and three chapters daily in the rest of the Old Testament. Better set a time early in the day when you can read your Bible alone. Do not rush. Read consecutively chapter after chapter through a book. Memorize favorite verses. Pray for God to use the Scriptures in your heart. Read not less than one chapter reverently every day, and you should average at least four chapters daily. Shame on a Christian who has never even read his Bible through!

2. You should have a special time of secret prayer everyday, preferably in the morning. It may be in connection with your Bible reading. Be sure to thank God for His mercies. Take every burden to God, every earnest desire of your heart and keep praying till you have peace. Confess your sins, mistakes and failures daily and have them out of the way, cleansed and forgiven. It is better if possible to have a regular time and a customary place for secret prayer. However, one should pray all through the day, should join in family prayers, etc.

3. Does your home have family worship? It should include reading aloud of the Bible by every member of the family old enough to read. It ought to include prayer by every member of the family who is saved. The family altar ought to be made so important that every member of the family is expected to be present, even more important than being to school on time, or at work on time. If people are late in school or work a time or two, they will learn to co-operate, get up earlier, and expect God's blessing. The family altar will not succeed unless it is counted important, and only on unusual occasion should any member of the family be excused.

In my judgment, the best time for most families is immediately after breakfast. Set breakfast early enough, get everybody ready, have Bibles at hand, push back the plates and read while all are at the table. When my children were at home, we read consecutively two verses each, around the table, through a chapter (or with short Psalms, through two chapters). Mrs. Rice and I still follow this plan. Thus everyone must pay attention, everyone takes part, and children learn to read the Bible and pronounce the words. Then have prayer, each one in order, around the table. Of course, we have thanks before all the meals besides this. Why not establish family worship in your home, for the new year?

4. Do you tithe? That is, do you give one-tenth of your income to the Lord and His cause? God required tithes under the ceremonial law. Surely a Christian under grace should not do less. God blesses those who love Him enough to put Him first on the money question. I thank God for marvelous blessings given in connection with my tithing. Will you give God the first tenth of your income this year? Remember, the tithe is the Lord's, so ask Him where to give every dollar. It does not belong to the deacons, to the finance committee, nor to the church but to the Lord. Support your local church in proportion as its work is worthy and other work as God leads.

It Is Written



<u>Mayo on Alcohol</u> A Remarkable Statement By A Remarkable Man We publish the following statement by Dr. Charles H. Mayo by special permission from the Mayo family, Rochester, Minnesota. In addressing a large convention of boys, Dr. Mayo said in part:

"You can get along with a wooden leg, but you can't get along with a wooden head. The physical value of man is not so much. Man, as analyzed in our laboratories, is worth about ninety-eight cents; seven bars of soap, lime enough to whitewash a chicken coop, phosphorous enough to cover the heads of a thousand matches. This is not very much you see. It is the brain that counts. But in order that your brain may be kept clear you must keep your body fit and well. That cannot be done if one drinks liquor. A man who has to drag around a habit that is a danger and a menace to society ought to go off to the woods and live alone. We do not tolerate the obvious use of morphine or cocaine or opium, and we should not tolerate intoxicating liquor because I tell you these things are what break down the command of the individual over his own life and his own destiny. Through alcohol a man loses his coordination. That is why liquor is no advantage to the brain. You hear people tell how they had their wits quickened for the first half-hour by liquor, but they don't tell you how later their bodies could not act in coordination with their brain.'
