#### FIRST: THE PRAISE EXPECTED.

**PSALM 100:1-2** 

"Make a joyful noise....come before his presence with singing."

This should be the natural attitude of the person that claims they are a child of God, but sadly not all that profess their faith in Christ share this attitude. In many it's indifference, irritations, indignation, and impatience that drains the praise and joy out of the children of God.

We are to welcome the God of Heaven into our life just as we would receive a king into our home. When you welcome someone into your home, you try to make them feel as though they are part of your family. Notice: "Serve the Lord with gladness."

#### SECOND: THE PERSONAL ASSURANCE REQUIRED. PSALM 100:3

"Know ye that the Lord he is God...we are his people."

It is not enough to know about God, but we are to personally know the Lord.

- Know Him as Saviour.
- 2. Know Him as the Sovereign.
- Know Him in service.

#### THIRD: THE PRACTICE THAT IS TO BE SEEN AND HEARD. PSALMS 100:4

"Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise..."

The condition of our heart will always be revealed by what we allow to proceed out of our mouth. There should be "thanksgiving" and "praise."

God's people are to be faithful to God's house. They are personally invited by the Lord Himself to enter, not only into the house of God, but into the Lord's presence.

Kim Kline's 3-Ingredient Sweet Potato Casserole with Maple Pecans Olive oil (for pan) 5 1/2 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled, cut into 1 1/2" pieces

Baking

2 tsp. kosher salt, divided, plus more

2 cups pecan halves (about 7 ounces)

1 1/4 cups pure maple syrup, 1 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper, divided

Preheat oven to 350°F. Oil a 3-qt. baking dish. Cook potatoes in a large pot of boiling salted water until very tender, about 12 minutes. Drain; let sit in colander 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat 1/2 cup syrup in a large skillet over medium-high. Add pecans, 3/4 tsp. salt, and 1 tsp. pepper and cook, stirring constantly, until syrup has evaporated and pecans are glazed, about 5 minutes. Transfer to a parchment-lined rimmed baking sheet and let cool.

Purée potatoes, 1 1/2 cups water, and remaining 3/4 cup syrup, 1 1/4 tsp. salt, and 1/2 tsp. pepper in a food processor until smooth. Transfer potato mixture to prepared baking dish.

Coarsely chop pecans and sprinkle evenly over potato mixture.

Bake casserole until top is lightly browned, about 40 minutes. Let sit 15 minutes before serving.

#### 1621 FIRST THANKSGIVING CHEESECAKE

1 cup graham cracker crumbs 1 cup sugar 4 pkg. (8 oz. each) Philadelphia Cream Cheese, softened 1/4 cup butter, melted 1 tsp. vanilla 2 tbsp. sugar 4 eggs

Heat oven to 325°F. Combine graham crumbs, butter and 2 Tbsp. sugar; press onto bottom of 10-inch cast-iron skillet sprayed with cooking spray. Beat cream cheese with vanilla and remaining sugar in

large bowl with mixer until blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing on low speed after each just until blended. Pour over crust. (Note: Pan will be very full.) Place pan on baking sheet, then place in oven. Bake 50 to 55 min. or until center of cheesecake is almost set. Cool completely. Refrigerate 4 hours.

<u>Special Extra:</u> Garnish finished cheesecake with nuts, and regional Thanksgiving fruits, such as cranberries, grapes, figs, blueberries, and/or raspberries.

A Young Man Should Not Hesitate To Draw His Sword Against Evil.

1 Samuel 1:14-15, "And David said unto him, How wast thou not afraid to stretch forth thine hand to destroy the LORD'S anointed? And David called one of the young men, and said, Go near, and fall upon him. And he smote him that he died."

The latter part of King Saul's reign was marked by jealousy and insecurity against David. King Saul hated him, haunted him, and hunted him. Twice, while Saul sought for David, God allowed David opportunity to kill Saul. Twice, David could have taken Saul's life. But David understood a principle — you do not lift up your hand against divinely appointed authority.

When the news came of Saul and Jonathan's death, from David's lips is delivered a tender and gracious epitaph (*II Samuel 1:17-27*). He also delivered swift justice to the Amalekite

who claimed to have slain Saul. David called to one of his young men to "fall upon" this messenger with a sword. The Amalekite died that day because he had dared to lift up his sword against God's anointed leader of Israel.

Young man, there are times to draw your sword against evil. God's appointed leader for every home is the father. A young man who stands passively by while someone mocks, disobeys or ridicules his father is not a man, but a boy. God's anointed leader for your church is your pastor. A boy stands mute mouth while others seek to slay his pastor with their tongues, but a man draws his sword! Never lift up your hand against God's appointed authority (whether it be a Sunday School teacher, your youth pastor, your boss, etc.), and never let any other man stand in your presence and do it unchallenged.

#### Turn

"Turn you at my reproof: behold, I will pour out my spirit unto you, I will make known my words unto you." Proverbs 1:23

I said it more than once: "Don't ever try to touch the curling iron. You will get burned, and it will hurt for a long time."

Our young son had a hard time processing that com mand. I could tell by the look on his little face that he was still considering giving that curling iron a quick touch, just to see for himself.

Or to feel it for himself. The scream that came from the bathroom the day he finally got his way could be heard even with the windows closed. Our son had gone into the bathroom and grabbed the curling iron by the hot barrel. Never mind that I had the door closed and that he had been instructed not to go into the bathroom. This wasn't a baby; this was a four-year-old. Curiosity, along with a healthy dose of stubbornness, won over

obedience. He was fortunate that the burns were only mild, but the big bandage on his little hand was a daily reminder of the cost of ignoring instructions.

Can you be corrected, or do you have to test to see if God is serious about what He said? "I can do this if I want to" has caused a lot of unnecessary pain.

When God says, "Don't go that way," turn around. When God says, "Turn," He is trying to provide another chance for us to reverse our course before we get hurt. Just as our son had a choice and could have left the curling iron alone, we have a choice to turn when we're being corrected.

#### **Pure Words**

Proverbs 8:9 says, "They are all plain to him that under standeth, and right to them that find knowledge." Proverbs 30:5 says, "Every word of God is pure...." What more do you want! How much plainer can it be? This verse was written 500 to 600 years after Moses. Solomon, who was the wisest man in all the world, said that every word of God "is pure" at that time.

Proverbs 30:6 says, "Add thou not unto his words...." Solomon said not to add anything to the word of God. He said, "Do not add anything to the book of Genesis. Do not add any thing to Exodus. Do not you add anything to Leviticus or Numbers or Deuteronomy." Solomon said that at that time every word of God that he had was pure.

In Luke 24:27, Jesus is talking and says, "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself." He

continues in verse 44, "... These are the words which I spake unto you, while I was yet with you, that all things must be fulfilled, which were written in the law of Moses, and in the prophets, and in the psalms, concerning me." David said, "Don't add anything to the Pentateuch." Jesus said, "All the words are true in the Pentateuch, in the Psalms, and the prophets."

John 15:7 says, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." The Bible says, "my words," not "my thoughts" or "my truths" or "my doctrine." No! It says, "my words." If the words of God must abide in you so that you can get your prayers answered, then the words of God must be somewhere. Would Jesus have told us to do something that was impossible to do?

#### **Undeserved Positions**

Ruth 2:13, "Let me find favour in thy sight, my lord; for that thou hast comforted me, and for that thou hast spoken friendly unto thine handmaid, though I be not like unto one of thine handmaidens." In other words, she was saying, "You have treated me like one of your own handmaidens, even though I am not." The third truth is that grace places us in undeserved positions. That is what grace does. We do a pretty good job of thinking that we deserve everything we have. We do an even better job of thinking that we deserve more than we have. After all, we are not as bad as the rest of the world. Are we? That is the way we think, but grace places all of us in undeserved positions. Grace gives us a second chance. When we fail God, we do not deserve a second chance. When we disappoint Him, we do not deserve a second chance. How many of us are way past our second chance? God puts us in a place of undeserved positions.

Ruth said, "You have made me as one of your handmaidens, even though I am not." When grace puts us in an undeserved position, we become like one of the family. When we trust Christ as our Saviour, we become part of the family. God is our Heavenly Father. I am a child of God! If we are saved by that grace, we are a child of God! We belong in His family. We do not deserve that, but grace places us in undeserved positions. We are part of the family of God. We do not deserve it; but glory to God, He has bestowed that upon us. We need to put things in perspective. God loved us enough to send His Son to die on the cross and pay for our sins. When we accepted that payment and that gift, we became part of His family. This is a position we do not deserve, a claim that there is only one reason we can make, because God's grace places us in undeserved positions.

The majority of the credit for making the annual Thanksgiving holiday a national holiday goes to Sarah Josepha Hale. She was the editor of Ladies Magazine and Godey's Lady's Book. In 1827 she began to advocate for Thanksgiving by printing articles in the magazines. She also published stories and recipes, and wrote letters to governors, senators, and presidents. It took her 36 years to persuade the President and Congress to her point of view. On October 3, 1863, supported by the Union victory at Gettysburg, President Lincoln proclaimed November 26 a national day of Thanksgiving, to be observed every year on the fourth Thursday of November.
