THE WORD OF GOD

<u>Introduction:</u> The Word of God is the Christian's greatest need. The Word is not only essential in every part of the Christian life, but it is the one thing that is to be exalted even above the name of God.

I made that statement a few years ago and a man said, "Pastor, I agreed with almost everything you said until you said that the Word of God was to be exalted even above the name of Jesus. You are wrong." I asked if I could show Him clear cut proof. He said that would be acceptable. I turned to *Psalm 138:2. "...For thou has magnified thy word above all thy name..."*

Why is that? Why does God exalt His word above everything else?

FIRST: BECAUSE SALVATION IS IMPOSSIBLE WITHOUT IT.

I PETER 1:23

"Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the Word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

Regardless of what any religion or preacher tells you, the fact is, no one can be saved outside of faith provided by, and faith in the Word of God.

Romans 10:17, "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God."

John 5:24, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life..."

Illustration: The emphasis on preaching of the Word is found throughout the Bible. John the Baptist preached, Jesus our Saviour preached, Matthew preached, Mark preached, Luke preached, John preached, the Apostle Peter preached, Paul the Apostle preached. II Timothy 4:2, "Preach the Word..."

SECOND: BECAUSE SPIRITUAL GROWTH DEPENDS UPON IT.

MATTHEW 13:23

"But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the Word and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

The ground is a symbol of your mind. The seed is a symbol of God's Word. When the seed entered into the ground and was accepted, then it took root and began to grow.

What are we to learn? Get the Word deep into the soul of your mind. In a year's time, you will grow so that people will see you differently.

By the way, most people go to church as a ritual. You may even go every Sunday, but you do not grow. If you did you would know that it is the Word that produces the growth.

THIRD: BECAUSE SEPARATION DEMANDS IT.

MATTHEW 4:1-4

"And when the temptor came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread. And he answered and said, "It is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God."

We have rules, laws and standards. These rules are found in the Word of God. That's why the battle has always been over the Word of God. It is not whether or not hell has real fire, or that the streets of Heaven are paved with gold. If we believe the Bible, then we know these things are true.

Just what is the final authority? Some say it is the church. Others say the Pope. Others say the congregation is the authority. They are wrong. The final authority on any subject is the Word of God.

Spiritual Leadership

In Hebrews 13:17 we are commanded to, "obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves," and he speaks of spiritual rulers that watch over our souls, that is, pastors and Christian leaders. Again in *Hebrews 13:24* the author says by inspiration of the Holy Spirit, "Salute all them that have the rule over you," manifestly referring to Christian leaders. Pastors and preachers have a real authority from God to rule. But a woman is not to have authority over men, and so a woman could not be a pastor of a church, or a preacher of the gospel, in the ordinary sense.

An evangelist also must speak with authority. Paul commanded Timothy, "Do the work of an evangelist" (II Tim. 4:5). But Timothy, the evangelist, was also given these instructions: "These things command and teach. Let no man despise thy youth ..." (I

Tim. 4:11, 12). An evangelist has authority from God and must not be despised, even though young. But no woman is to take authority over men, and no woman can be an evangelist in the Bible sense. There were no women evangelists in Bible times and there should be none now.

No Saloons in Heaven I Corinthians 6:10-11

No drunkard will inherit the Kingdom of heaven. Now, let those mothers whose children are beginning a frivolous life, wake up. Do not rest day or night until your children are converted by the power of God's grace, because no drunkard will inherit the Kingdom of God. These moderate drinkers will become drunkards; no person ever became a drunkard all at once. How the devil blinds these moderate drinkers! I do not know of any sin more binding than the sin of alcoholism; the person is bound hand and foot before he knows it.

Some time ago, I was reading an account of snake-worshipping in India. I thought it was a horrible thing. I read of a mother who saw a snake come into

her home and coil itself around her little, six month old infant. She thought that the reptile was such a sacred thing that she did not dare to touch it. She watched that snake destroy her child. She heard her baby's pitiful cries, but dared not rescue it. My soul revolted as I read it. But I do not know that we don't have things right here in America that are just as bad as that serpent in India. Serpents are coming into many Christian homes, coiling around many children and binding them hand and foot, and the fathers and mothers seem to be asleep.

O, may the Spirit of God wake us up! No drunkard will inherit the Kingdom of God. Bear it in mind. "Woe unto him that givest his neighbor drink" (Habakkuk 2:15). I pity any professed Christians who rent their property for drinking saloons. I pity them from the depths of my heart. If you ever expect to inherit the Kingdom of God, give it up. If you can never rent your property to better purpose, you had better let it stand empty. The idea that all is going well, and that all are going into the Kingdom of God, whether they repent or not, is not taught anywhere in Scripture.

Since this is true, then what we believe and do is because of what the Bible says, meaning that we are to attend church faithfully because the Bible says we are to do so. Hebrews 10:25. We are to go soul winning and present the Word to unbelievers to give them an opportunity to believe because the Bible says so. Matthew 28:19-20.

FOURTH: BECAUSE THE SWORD OF THE SPIRIT IS THE WORD OF GOD.

"And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the Word of God."

When the Word of God is presented to someone, then the Holy Spirit takes the Word presented and convicts the person of sin, righteousness, and judgment. He, the Spirit, goes deep to where nothing natural can reach and works a miracle inside the one hearing the Word.

Notice: Hebrews 4:12, "For the Word of God...piercing...discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heard."

Why do you think people are so fearful of the Bible especially when it is preached? Answer, because they get under conviction as the Holy Spirit convicts them through what they are hearing.

Illustration: I remember watching a 6'4" man almost break a pew while listening to a message on salvation because he knew he was not saved.

FIFTH: BECAUSE SUPPLICATION IS MOTIVATED BY THE WORD.

"Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their hearts, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the Apostles, men and brethren, what shall we do?"

Acts 2:41-42, "Then they that gladly received his word were baptized...continued in...prayers." Nothing will drive you to your knees in prayer like listening and placing your faith in the Word of God.

Notice: John 15:7 "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what you will, and it shall be done unto you.

Did you see that? Answer to your prayers, supplications are depended upon your relationship to the Word

The best way to get an appetite for something is to fill yourself with that item as often as you can. This is the Bible we are talking about. Fill yourself with it daily and you will develop appetites for whatever it contains as it enters your life.

Conclusion: Listen! God will not answer your prayers if you do not bathe in the Word of God. God will not change your head, nor direct your life unless you are willing to bathe in this old Book. Why do you get angry with God for what He does not do for you when you never check to see what He is asking you to do for Him?

Michigan Governor Says Abortions Are "Life-Sustaining"

The Democratic governor of Michigan, Gretchen Whitmer, recently called access to abortion during the coronavirus pandemic "life sustaining."

Planned Parenthood CEO: "We're Doing Everything We Can" During the Pandemic

Planned Parenthood acting CEO Alexis McGill Johnson sent out an urgent appeal for donations [May 5) promising that her abortion chain is "doing everything we can" to keep aborting unborn babies during the coronavirus pandemic.

...Johnson said they are striving to expand abortions through telemedicine, lawsuits against state health restrictions and more.

"The need for reproduction healthcare persists in a crisis and so do we," she wrote. "Planned Parenthood is doing everything we can to make sure care continues, including adapting and innovating the ways we provide it."

• Johnson is the acting CEO of the largest abortion group in America. Planned Parenthood aborted nearly 346,000 babies last year while reaping in \$1.6 billion in revenue.

Though abortions are unnecessary, life-destroying procedures, Johnson referred to them as "healthcare" and claimed they are "essential." *lifenews.com*

New York Mosque Still Open for Daily Prayers While Churches Across the Country Face Mandatory Shutdowns

A mosque in New York is reportedly still open for daily prayers amid the coronavirus pandemic that has forced Christian churches across the country to close their doors and cancel their in-person gatherings.

While churchgoers in many states have been criticized and even punished for continuing to gather, that same level of scrutiny has apparently not been leveled at the mosque...in Syracuse, New York.

Despite the state's executive order, which broadly bans all "non-essential gatherings of individuals of any size for any reason," neighborhood Muslims are still allowed [to] gather together in the mosque's prayer room for calls to prayer throughout the week.
