<u>Mexican Border War:</u> Saw action with the Louisiana National Guard. World War I: Platoon leader who fought at Chateau-Thierry, Belleau Wood, Boureschnes

and Soissons; wounded twice and received the Silver Star.

<u>1928:</u> Assigned to Nicaragua with the 2nd Marine Brigade and the Nicaragua National Guard Detachment; led jungle operations against organized bandits. Served in Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

World War II: Promoted to brigadier general; highly decorated for combat leadership at Saipan, Tinian, the Marianas and Iwo Jima. Later served as adviser for the Hollywood film "Sands of Iwo Jima."

Separation II Cor. 6:14-17

Separation from worldliness is not an end in itself; it is a means to an end. Separation is refraining from doing that which keeps us from doing what God intended for us to do. Separation is fixing the car, not so it can sit attractively in the garage, but so it can run and be useful. Separation is putting yourself into a position so you can do what God wants you to do. If all you do is dot every fundamental i and cross every fundamental t, and you do nothing of a positive nature for Christ, then God calls you a wicked and unprofitable servant.

Ladies who do not wear shorts, pants, mini-skirts or slits in their dresses can still be considered wicked and unprofitable servants, according to God. Men who do not

wear long hair, drink, smoke, go to movies, rent movies, buy movies, or listen to bad music can still be considered wicked and unprofitable servants, according to God. If you never bring a profit to God, then you are a wicked person. Some of the most wicked Christians sit in Bible-believing churches; God says they are wicked because they will stand before God and be judged by their works, and they will stand empty handed. Being an independent, King-James Bible-only, separated, Baptist Christian does not preclude you from being deemed wicked and unprofitable to God.

Separation is not simply getting right with God. It is making yourself available to work with God to cause others to become right with God. Getting right with God is serving God. Separation only puts you in a position to be able to serve Him.

Before going off to college, my pastor wisely said to me, 'Do not be surprised if, before you graduate, you face a trial (or trials).' Just days before leaving for college, my church went through a split. Oh, how my heart was saddened to see this occur--I loved all parties involved; but Jesus taught me through that trial to stand for the Man of God, and to stand for truth. It proved to be a very valuable lesson to this future pastor's wife!

Then, just months before graduating from Hyles-Anderson College (and while on my honeymoon), I had a reaction to medication that caused my mouth and the side of my face to be twisted. Dr. Streeter told me the medication caused a stroke. Here I was, a brand new bride, with only one semester left before I finished school, and my face was all twisted. To make matters worse, people were saying that my husband did it.

'Would my face stay like this?' I found I couldn't sing, and wondered how I would be able to do my student teaching. In my heart I wanted to hide, embarrassed by my physical appearance, and concerned that my wonderful husband was now saddled with more than he bargained for. It all seemed rather gloomy. What was I to do?

I had two choices: #1-to quit, and feel sorry for myself; or #2-to go on. I decided to go on. I continued to go soulwinning, and continued to attend church. I had to die to self. I could not allow myself to dwell on my physical appearance. I did not know if this condition would last or not. This truly was a trial like I had never known before, but it taught me to trust in the Lord more than ever—to rejoice in Him.

The Family Altar

Deuteronomy 6:7

I suggest that the reading be in the King James Version of the Bible. So-called "modern language" versions are usually paraphrases and not very accurate and sometimes have liberal, inaccurate rendering. The King James Version is the Bible of the people. It has the most beautiful language. The idea that the language of the King James Version of the Bible is archaic, hard to understand, is rather silly. I taught Shakespeare to college freshmen and sophomores, and the language of Shakespeare is ten times more archaic and obsolete than is the King James Bible.

Enjoy the Bible. If Dad and Mother find it sweet and blessed, and if the family regularly prays for God to be with them in their devotions, they will find it the happiest time of the day. Visitors who come to our home have again and again

remarked years later that the happiest memory of their visit was the family devotions. Then we would pray in a circle around the table. I would begin the prayer, then each one would follow in his own way, asking God for His blessing, asking help for the chores and duties of the day, asking for healing for someone who was sick, asking for help to win some particular soul, asking for help in the school work. Tiny children who cannot read the Bible can be taught a little memorized prayer so they can have part, and soon they can pray from the heart.

The family altar is a time also to praise good deeds, to rebuke quarrels, to settle problems. Besides, it means there is such close contact between parents and children that any time during the day (and sometimes during the night) a child will feel free to come to Dad or Mother for more prayer, or for help about a burden, or to confess a sin. There is no "generation gap" in the family where the authority of Father and Mother is clearly recognized and enforced, and where they have family devotions together.

How long will devotions take? Often not more than fifteen or twenty minutes; but what a precious time together!

Parmesan-Roasted Broccoli

Preheat oven to 425°. Trim the stalks of two 8-ounce broccoli crowns, removing any tough or dried exterior, then cut crowns into quarters from top to bottom. Drizzle with 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil; sprinkle all over, to taste, with salt, freshly ground black pepper, and red pepper flakes. Arrange broccoli on a parchment-lined rimmed baking sheet, then roast until crisp-tender, 10-12 minutes. Meanwhile, thinly slice 4 medium garlic cloves and toss with 1 teaspoon olive oil. Sprinkle the broccoli with garlic and roast until garlic is just beginning to turn golden around the edges, about 5 minutes. Sprinkle broccoli all over with 2 tablespoons freshly grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese and roast until cheese is melted and broccoli stalks are tender, 2-4 minutes. Toss with 1 teaspoon freshly grated lemon zest and serve.

Facebook Banning Christians but Allowing Sex Traffickers on Platform

While Facebook is known for cracking down on accounts linked to Christians and politically conservative individuals and groups, the platform is doing little to stop criminal organizations that use the networking site to profit off sex trafficking, said entertainment critic Ted Baehr...

Facebook employees sent numerous alerts to their bosses to report on human traffickers in the Middle East and armed groups in Ethiopia that are using the platform for sex trafficking and inciting violence against ethnic minorities, according to internal documents released by the Wall Street Journal in an investigative report.

Facebook was informed that a Mexican drug cartel was using the platform to recruit, train and pay hitmen; but the company didn't stop the cartel from posting on Facebook or Instagram, the documents show....

In the U.S., Facebook and other social media platforms use Section 230 of the U.S. Communications Decency Act to protect themselves from lawsuits over what users post online. One of the clauses of Section 230 states that what users say or write online is not akin to a publisher conveying the same message. However, the same clause that shields online platforms from liability is often used to ban conservative viewpoints. -Anugrah Kumar, christianpost.com

DOJ Likening Concerned Parents to Domestic Terrorists

The U.S. Department of Justice is facing immense pushback for suggesting that parents opposing the teaching of controversial curriculum in public schools are akin to domestic terrorists.

On [October 4] U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland sent a memorandum to federal law enforcement agencies "directing the Federal Bureau of Investigations, working with each United States Attorney, to convene meetings...for addressing threats against school administrators, board members, teachers and staff."

The memo cites a "disturbing spike in harassment intimidation and threats of violence against school administrators, board members, teachers and staff" as the justification for a federal response.

However, many have noted that it's the parents who've often been harassed and intimidated....

...Missouri Attorney General Eric Schmitt sent a letter to Garland condemning the DOJ's actions that could silence parents who want to have a voice in their children's education.

"Biden's Department of Justice is weaponizing its resources against parents who dare to advocate for their children. This dangerous federal overreach imposes a chilling effect on free speech by criminalizing dissent...,"Schmitt said in a press release accompanying | his letter to Garland.

 - By encouraging government extravagances, destroy its credit, produce fear of inflation with rising prices, and general discontent.

 - By specious argument, cause the breakdown of the moral virtues, honesty, sobriety, continence, faith in the pledged word, ruggedness.
