

Introduction: If you believe the Bible as I do, then this verse found in *I Timothy 5:8*, should shake you to the core.

"But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel."

The Bible does not hold back in its declaration as to the one that is to be the head of the home.

It is the father. Dad, it is your responsibility.

FIRST: THE POWER OF INFLUENCE.

"Even a child is known by his doings, whether his work be pure, and whether it be right." It is said that the average church has a child under its influence for approximately 1% of the child's time. The school has at least 16% of the child's time and the home is where a child spends 83% of its time. If this be true, then why are we losing our children? Because the home is giving it's own responsibility of training to outside influences.

The Bible teaches that God ordained two institutions: The Home and The Church. These two, and these two only, are for the training and influencing of your children.

Sadly, parents began to ignore their responsibility in raising and training their children and turned that job over to the secular government-controlled schools. In doing this, atheistic and humanistic teachers slowly infiltrated and took over these schools. The teachings of Christianity, the Bible, morals, and character building are no longer taught.

Fathers, it is your responsibility!

SECOND: THE PARENT'S LOVE.

EPHESIANS 5:25

ROMANS 1:27

PROVERS 20:11

"Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church, and gave himself for it."

There is nothing on earth that gives so much comfort and peace like that of a stable home. There is nothing so needed in society as that of an old-fashioned home with a husband, wife, and precious children that dwell in loving unity.

THIRD: THE PATTERN WE NOW SEE.

"And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burning in their lust one toward another; men with men..."

During WWII, while dad was off to war, moms, sisters, and girlfriends were put into the factories. When the war ended, most stayed in the factories. Now, both mom and dad spent *Continued*

<u>Family Principles</u> <u>Proverbs 22:6</u> Yes, we said "a sure success." This Scripture says, "*Train up a child in the way he*

should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." And there are other promises like that of *Psalm 1:1-3*, that a Christian avoiding bad company and meditating day and night in the Word of God is guaranteed, "...and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper." Let us say that God's plan for a Christian home works, and we should simply set out to follow His rules and trust Him to bring the results that He

wants us to have. The first great commandment about the home is, "Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee" (Exod. 20:12). And Ephesians 6:2 calls this, "... the first commandment with

promise."

But children only honor their parents if the parents exercise their authority and require the honor and obedience due them. In *Ephesians 6:4* is the command, "*Ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.*" That word "*nurture*" really means discipline. The Greek word there translated nurture is *paideia* and is defined in Young's Analytical Concordance as "nurture, instruction, chastening." That word is translated "*chastening*" three times in *Hebrews 12:5,7* and *11*, and the verb form of the word is translated "chasten" six times. Another form of the verb is translated "chastise" in *Luke 23:16,22* where Pilate said about Jesus, "*I will therefore chastise him, and release him.*"

So fathers ought to bring up children in the chastening and admonition of the Lord. And here God puts chastening before instruction. Chastising of a child is the part of love, for *Proverbs 13:24* says, "He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes." We are instructed, "Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying" (Prov. 19:18). Begin early and when you chastise do it thoroughly and get honest repentance.

Keep Yourselves Right Jude verse 20

How do we keep ourselves right? Jude says in verse 20, "But ye, beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith..." What does that mean? It means that we do not have to look for something new. What we received when we got saved was all that we needed. We are to build everything for the future on what happened when we were saved. That is the foundation. Who is supposed to build my faith? I am supposed to build my faith. You may say, "Well, the preacher is not building me up." He is not supposed to build you up. You are responsible to build yourself

up. The Bible says, on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Ghost. That means you have to encourage yourself. My friends, welcome to the real world of injustices. There is no such thing as pure justice. When my children complained about injustices in their lives, I told them, "Welcome to the real world!" Our philosophy was not "innocent until proven guilty"; rather, it was "guilty until proven innocent." Mrs. Gray and I never tore down the authorities in front of our children.

A young person must come to realize life is composed of ups and downs, victories and defeats. The sooner a young person accepts full responsibility for his or her actions in life, the sooner that young person will mature into adulthood. Very few people who get into serious trouble ever recognize they are fully responsible for their actions.

God comes to a young person who has no character and says, "It is your fault!" God comes to a young person with bad study habits and says, "It is your fault!" Marriage Before Fatherhood Ephesians 5:25



Dr. Curtis Hutson The relationship of husband and wife is a picture of the relationship of Christ and the church. *Ephesians 5:23* says the husband is the head of the wife, *"even as Christ is the head of the church."* The head? Yes. He bears the same relationship to his wife that Christ bears to the church.

The husband and wife have different roles to play. When we were born, God assigned us a body. If He assigned us a male body, we have one role to play; if He assigned a female body, the role is different. The married life is a live drama. The moment we say, "I do," and are pronounced husband and wife, the curtain rises and the drama begins, and there is no interrupting it until we die. That is what the marriage vow means when it says "till death do us part."

The man is to play the role of Christ; and the woman, the role of the church. That means that I, as a husband, am to play the role of Christ to my wife, not just on special occasions but twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, fifty-two weeks a year, until I die. If I blow it, I have simply blown it. I cannot let the curtain down and start again. It is a live drama.

But if my wife doesn't play her role as the church, that still doesn't excuse me. I am to identify my responsibility, making sure I do what I am supposed to do.


The man may be married to a woman who makes his life difficult. He may complain, "My wife doesn't play her role." That simply means that you will have to do a better job in playing your role.

<u>California Governor Signs "Kill More Babies" Bill</u> <u>Forcing Taxpayers to Fund More Abortions</u>

California Governor Gavin Newsom has signed the "Kill More Babies" bill that would force taxpayers in the Golden State to fund more abortions...

California Bill Would Allow Killing Babies Up to Twenty-Eight Days After Birth

California policymakers who make up the "Future of Abortion Council" just dropped a bombshell. They intend not only to codify the killing of unborn children throughout all nine months of pregnancy but to decriminalize killing newborns days or even weeks after birth.

New language added to AB 2223...revealed the disturbing intent. The proposed legislation would shield a mother from civil and criminal charges for any "actions or omissions" related to her pregnancy, "including miscarriage, stillbirth, or abortion, or perinatal death." Although definitions of "perinatal death" vary, all of them include the demise of newborns seven days or more after birth...

A few weeks ago, Maryland introduced a bill that "decriminalizes neglecting newborns to death" using the same "perinatal death" language, though the bill hearing was canceled. In 2019, Virginia Governor Ralph Northam was widely condemned for a radio interview asserting doctors could decide to allow children to die after birth "if that's what the mother and the family desired."

AB 2223 is not only a pro-abortion bill, it removes all civil and criminal penalties for killing babies born alive under any circumstances. The bill expressly authorizes any person to facilitate

Faith of a Father Hebrews 11:1-7

The Bible says that Noah was warned of God of things not seen as yet. In *Hebrews 11:1*, we are told that the definition of faith includes the evidence of things not seen. God's commands, not our sight, should determine our actions. Often, we must obey God even though we cannot see the benefit of following God's Word. So much of the Christian life is based upon living and doing that which we cannot comprehend by sight. What makes faith to be faith is that we do it without sight. In essence, all of the characters we read about in this chapter obeyed God based upon faith, without evidence of what they had yet seen. Our tendency is to obey God when we can see the end result, but that is not true faith. Noah had never seen a flood and, most likely, had never seen rainfall. Yet, he obeyed God based upon His Word, not upon what he had seen.

The Bible says that he moved with fear. We may assume that it was a flood that he feared. However, he had never seen a flood so that cannot be the case. We often fear what we know is dangerous or can harm us. Noah had no source of reference to give him fear regarding a flood. Noah's fear was of God, not of a flood. Far too often our faith is based upon our fear of circumstances, but that is not faith. Faith is when we obey God because we know that He is holy and righteous. It is not a fear of terror. It is a fear because we know that God is great and mighty. It is a reverential respect for the power and might of God. Noah performed the task assigned to him with great haste because of his fear of God within, not the fear of flood without.

The Bible says that he prepared an ark to the saving of his house. It was not merely an act of saving his own life. Noah, by faith, obeyed God for the sake of his own family. Far too often we do not consider our families when we make decisions. People who live by faith typically are people who do so, not as an act of self-service, but for the purpose of the benefits it brings to their families. Men of faith understand the importance of doing what they do for the sake of sparing their own families. People who do not live by faith do not take into consideration the consequences that can come to their families as a result of their faithlessness.
