FIRST: THE PRESENCE OF ANGELS. GENESIS 16:7

The word 'angel' first occurs in the book of Genesis where the angel of the Lord ministered to Hagar after she had been mistreated by Sarah.

The Bible teaches that God created the angels, but the exact time is not mentioned.

Colossians 1:16, "For by him were all things created, that are in Heaven, and that are in the earth, visible and invisible."

Jesus spoke of guardian angels in Matthew 18:10, Jesus said, "Take heed that ye despise not one of these little ones; for I say unto you, that in Heaven their angels do always behold the face of my father which is in Heaven."

Illustration: In *Hebrews 13:2* we are told, "...some have entertained angels unawares." Which means that they come and go among us without revealing themselves.

SECOND: THE POWER OF ANGELS.

ACTS 12.7

Angels are not bound by natural human laws; angels can enter locked prisons; open locked doors - *Acts 5:19*; and ascend in a flame - *Judges 13:19-20*.

Angels can travel great distances very quickly from Heaven to earth, which are light years apart. In *Daniel 10:12-13*, an angel apologized for being 21 days late.

Angels are powerful:

- 1. II Kings 19:35, One angel killed 185,000 Assyrian soldiers.
- 2. II Samuel 24:15-16, One angel killed 70,000 Israelites.
- 3. Matthew 28:2-4, An angel rolled away the stone at the tomb of Jesus Christ.
- 4. Luke 20:35, Angels are immortal.
- 5. *Matthew 22:30*, Angels are sexless and do not marry.

Illustration: I cannot tell you how many stories I have read about missionaries being threatened by death and their enemies fled saying they saw soldiers surrounding the missionaries, yet the missionaries saw nothing.

THIRD: THE PREDOMINANCE OF ANGELS.

REVELATION 5:11

"...I heard the voice of many angels round about the throne...and the number of them was ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands."

The Bible makes it plain in *Matthew 22:30*, that angels were created by God and live eternally. It also makes it plain that they do not increase in numbers as they do not reproduce themselves. They have a body which can be identified. You will discover that Michael is an angel, and that Gabriel is an angel.

Harriet Beecher Stowe

Hatty had gone with her father to Ripley, Ohio, a town fifty miles upriver from Cincinnati. They stayed in the home of the Rev. John Rankin, where they had noticed something strange. A lamp was left burning, all night long, in the window facing the river. Hatty asked why.

Reverend Rankin said in a low voice that the lamp was a signal for runaway slaves on the Kentucky side of the river. If they could reach his home, they would get food and shelter. Then someone would take them to the next safe stop north on the Underground Railroad.

Reverend Rankin told stories about the many slaves he had helped since he first lit his lamp in 1825. She remembered one story most of all.

It had happened in March, several years before. A spell of warm weather was cracking the ice that covered the wide Ohio River. An escaped slave woman, her baby in her arms, stood on the Kentucky shore. She could see the warm glow of the Rankins' light. The ice stretched

away before her, dappled with dark puddles and cracks. She took a deep breath and darted onto the ice. After a few yards, her bare feet slipped and she fell. She leaped up again and kept running. Again and again she fell and got up, until she was soaking wet, her teeth chattering with the cold. Finally she reached the Ohio shore. Then she made the long, hard climb to the Rankins' house.

Something else was growing within her as well. It was an idea for a book. A grand idea, sweeping and passionate. Hatty started to write. Somehow she found the time. Instead of just wishing she could be a writer, she became one.

As she wrote, she thought of the stories she had heard back in Ohio. Most of all, she remembered the runaway slave woman crossing the river with her baby just before the ice broke.

Hatty remembered other stories. Her brother Charles had gone south to work in New Orleans. He was soon back in Cincinnati, full of terrible tales of slavery. He told Hatty about a cruel Yankee slave boss on a farm in Louisiana. The slave master told Charles to feel his fist, bragging that it "had got as hard as iron by knocking down niggers."

With stories like these in mind, Harriet Beecher Stowe wrote Uncle Tom's Cabin. The book came out in 1852 and stunned the nation. It went on to become one of the most famous books of all time. It was all made-up, a work of fiction, but it was based on facts.

Hatty put into her book all the fury, tenderness and passion that had filled her life during her 18 years in Cincinnati. But the book did more than thrill her readers. It also made them see just how terrible slavery was. Many people had opposed slavery before the book. But Uncle Toms Cabin made the horrors of slavery come alive for them. It made them willing to fight to end it.

Soon American was at war with itself. The Civil War began in 1861, less than 10 years after Hatty Stowe's book was published. Now Hatty was the most famous author in America. She even met President Abraham Lincoln. He shook her hand and said, "So this is the little woman who wrote the book that caused the big war."

Evangelism And Education

It is a foolish idea, fostered by those who hate evangelism, that the evangelists are ignorant men who deal only in the emotions, who do very superficial work, and are generally unlearned. The exact opposite is the case. Not only have leading evangelists been men of great learning, but they have done more to establish Christian education than any other single group of ministers.

D. L. Moody founded Moody Bible Institute, Northfield School for Girls, Mount Hermon School for Boys, and the largest Bible Institute in the British Isles. In fact, Bible Institutes throughout the world are patterned after the work of D. L. Moody and R. A. Torrey, both of whom were evangelists. Dr. J. Wilbur Chapman was once vice president of Moody Bible Institute. The University of Pennsylvania grew out of a charity school founded by Evangelist George Whitefield. Charles G. Finney founded Oberlin College and Seminary. Evangelist John A. Davis established the Practical Bible Training School at Johnson City,

New York, which school now bears his name. And what else could you call John Wesley but an evangelist, preaching constantly to the unsaved, reviving the saints of God, and leading the Wesleyan revival? Surely these schools that came out of that

great revival should be credited to evangelism.

Jonathan Edwards, who had five hundred converted from one sermon, died as president of what is now Princeton University. Charles H. Spurgeon was pastor of the Metropolitan Tabernacle In London. But surely we must all agree that his work was preeminently that of an evangelist. He continually led in the work of revival of the saints and of the winning of the lost to Christ, and uncounted thousands were saved through his ministry. Yet he founded the famous Pastor's College. Evangelist Bob Jones founded Bob Jones University, which has some four thousand students enrolled this year at Greenville, South Carolina.

These are only a few illustrations; many others could be given showing that evangelists have been one of the most potent forces in all Christian education. There are scores more that we do not have time to list.

David Brainerd

There is a marker located on the roadside in Haddam, CT, at the place of David Brainerd's birth. It reads, "Opposite this spot was born April 20th, 1718, David Brainerd, a servant of God, wise in his knowledge of men, self-forgetful in his devotion, of single-hearted humility, careless of the dangers of the frontier, undismayed before failing health, he gave his brief manhood to the material and spiritual upbuilding of the Indians. He died at Northampton, Massachusetts, October 9, 1747." The marker also tells of the life of his brother John, who carried on David's work after his death.

Every believer ought to read the Diary of David Brainerd. It's very easy to find online. It was published by Jonathan Edwards after Brainerd's death. Although Jonathan Edwards is known as America's first theologian, Brainerd's Diary has outsold every other book that Edwards ever published. It's never been out of print since it was first published in 1749. John Wesley said that every preacher of the Gospel should carefully read David Brainerd's diary.

There's no accounting for how David Brainerd's five-year ministry has had such a powerful impact on multitudes of people; all the glory goes to the powerful God he

loved and served.

Florida Surgeon General's Warnings About Dangers of mRNA Vaccinations

What Kind Of Seed Are You Sowing?



Without doubt the hymn that has influenced children for Christ more than any other is this simply stated one, written in 1860 by Anna Bartlett Warner, Miss Warner wrote this text in collaboration with her sister Susan as a part of one of the best-selling novels of that day, a novel written by Susan entitled Say and Seal. Today few remember the plot of that novel, which stirred the hearts of many readers. But the simple poem spoken by one of the characters, Mr. Linden, as he comforts Johnny Fax, a dying child, still remains the favorite hymn of children around the world to this day.

Anna and Susan Warner were highly educated and deeply devoted Christian young women who lived all of their lives along the Hudson River in New York, in

a lovely but secluded area apart from the busy world. Their home was near the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, and for a number of years these two sisters conducted Sunday School classes for the young cadets. Their home, Good Crag, was willed to the Academy and made into a national shrine. Both sisters were buried with military honors in recognition of their spiritual contributions to the lives of the young military officers.
