Take Time To Review

I always use the following: "Now, Mr. Doe, there are only four things you must know to be saved. First, you must know that you are a sinner. For example, Romans 3:10 says, 'As it is written. There is none righteous, no, not one.' Let me illustrate. If there is none righteous, that means I'm not righteous, doesn't it? (Notice, I didn't get him unrighteous first; I got me unrighteous. Never put the sinner below you. You always let him know that but for the grace of God you would be in the fix he is in. You get yourself lost first) So if there is none righteous, I'm not righteous. If there is none righteous, then Mr. Doe, you are not righteous. Also, it says, 'For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.' Now if all have sinned, that means I've sinned-right? That means your wife has sinned, and that means you have sinned."

Second, show him the price on sin. Romans 5:12: "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin...." What kind of death? All death, both spiritual and physical death, the sum total of death, "...and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned." And Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death ... " So there is a price on sin. What is that price? Death. What kind of death? That includes the second death of *Revelation 20:14*, and that second death is the Lake of Fire. So ultimately a person who is a sinner must pay for it by going to Hell. That is the basic price on sin.

Third, the next thing we must do is show that Jesus paid the price. So I say this: "Mr. Doe, God looked down from Heaven and saw that you were a sinner. He saw that you were in debt He saw that you and I deserved to go to Hell. He wanted to save us and made a plan to do it He came to the world Himself. His name was Jesus. He was God in a human body. For thirty-three years He lived here in this world. He did not commit one single sin. This is important. Mr. Doe, suppose that Jesus Christ had sinned one time only. The price of sin being death or Hell, where would Jesus have had to go when He died? The answer is Hell, but He did not sin. He did not commit one sin, but He went to the cross, and on the cross He suffered spiritual death when He said, 'My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?' He suffered the same thing that a lost person will have to suffer in Hell. I'll go farther than that. I believe that He suffered as much in that moment on Calvary as the sum total eternal suffering of all the lost people who will ever go to Hell to stay forever. Actually He was paying our price for our sins. He was becoming our substitute."

Fourth, "If we will receive that price as our hope for Heaven and receive Him as our Saviour from sin, He will make us His children and take us to Heaven when we die."

J. R. R. Tolkein

C.S. Lewis and J. R. Tolkien formed one of the greatest friendships of all time. This friendship was spawned in war and revealed in their writings.

As officers with the British Expeditionary Force, both men experienced the horrors of trench warfare. Tolkien, a second lieutenant, arrived in France in 1916 and fought at the Battle of the Somme, one of the bloodiest battles in military history. He contracted trench fever, which took him out of the war. Lewis.

also a second lieutenant, arrived on the Western Front in 1917, on his 19th birthday. He was wounded by a mortar shell, and his

injuries took him out of harm's way for the remainder of the war.

Lewis and Tolkien. They became scholars at Oxford University, met in 1926 and forged a friendship that enriched both writers. They produced epic tales of heroism in the face of great evil: Tolkien wrote "The Hobbit" and "The Lord of the Rings," while Lewis wrote "The Chronicles of Narnia," "The Space Trilogy" and many other works.

Though Tolkien and Lewis dreaded the idea of war, both believed that war would sometimes be necessary to preserve justice and protect the innocent. During the Second World War, Lewis made this observation about the peace movements of the previous decade: "We now know that an angry and terrified pacifism is one of the roads that lead to war."

As for Tolkien, I think his view is summarized best by Faramir, captain of Gondor: "War must be, while we defend our lives against a destroyer who would devour all," he explains. "But I do not love the bright sword for its sharpness, nor the arrow for its swiftness, nor the warrior for his glory. I love only that which they defend."

It was Tolkien that led a skeptical Lewis to receive Christ as his Personal Saviour.

Detransitioning Navy SEAL Says Transition "Destroyed My Life"

Chris Beck, a retired Navy SEAL who announced nearly a decade ago that he wanted to change his sex, has revealed that he is now detransitioning. Beck, who served as a Navy SEAL for 20 years, explained in a recent podcast interview with conservative filmmaker Robby Starbuck that he wants to share his experience to help young people who may be considering transitioning. Beck described how it only took a one-hour visit with Veterans Affairs to be offered 'hormones for gender transition. "I walked into a psychologist's office [and] in one day, I have a letter in my hand saying I was transgender....I had so much going wrong... when I started taking those [hormones].

"Some of that was paid for by the VA, and I'm sorry to the American people that I did that," Beck stated. Beck also asserted that people should not believe his 2013 CNN appearance during which he told Anderson Cooper why he wanted to identify as a woman. "Everything you see on CNN with my face, do not even believe a word of it. Everything that happened to me for the last 10 years destroyed my life." —*christianpost.com*

It is estimated that Fanny Crosby wrote more than 8,000 gospel song texts in her lifetime. Her hymns have been and are still being sung more frequently than those of any other gospel hymn writer. Her many favorites have been an important part of evangelical worship for the past century.

It is truly amazing that anyone, and especially a blind person, could write on this variety of spiritual truths and experiences with such proliferation. For a considerable period during her life, while under contract to a music publisher, she wrote three new hymns each week. She used over 200 pen names besides her own. Many of her original texts are still being uncovered and no doubt will be published in the near future. Often the themes for her hymns were suggested by visiting ministers wishing to have a new song on a particular subject. At other times musician friends would first compose the music and then ask Fanny Crosby for the words.

Such was the case for the hymn, "Blessed Assurance." The music for the hymn was composed by Mrs. Joseph Knapp, an amateur musician, wife of the founder of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, and a close personal friend of Fanny Crosby. One day Mrs. Knapp played this melody for the blind poetess and asked, "What does this tune say?" Fanny responded immediately, "Why, that says: 'Blessed Assurance, Jesus Is Mine.""
