Spinach Cherry Salad

In a large bowl, whisk together 3 tablespoons white wine vinegar or champagne vinegar, 1 tablespoon honey and 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard. While whisking constantly, slowly drizzle in 7 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil. Whisk in 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt and 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper. Add 10 ounces baby spinach and I 3/4 cups cooked farro; toss to coat.

Add 2 cups halved pitted sweet cherries and 1 cup broken toasted walnuts; toss to combine. Top salad with 4 ounces crumbled soft goat cheese. Serve immediately.

Mothers are mentioned in the Bible some 363 times, but fathers over 1,300 times. The father was intended to be an image of God the Father, the high priest of his family, the king, the judge, the counselor, the provider, the avenger of wrong!

Man is to picture God. In *I Corinthians 11:7* the Scripture says, "For a man indeed ought not to cover his head, forasmuch as he is the image and glory of God: but the woman is the glory of the man." God is saying that a woman is given long hair as a veiling, a covering, a reminder and picture of submission to her husband and father; that if a woman have long hair, it is a glory to her, but if a man have long hair, it is a shame to him, for nobody is

between a man and Christ Jesus. So the man is not to wear long hair. Men take off their hats in church. So he represents God in a particular sense that women and children do not. The pronouns for God are He, His, Him.

So when Jesus taught us to pray, He said we should say, "Our Father, which art in heaven." And describing the tender, loving care of God, the psalmist said, "Like as a father pitieth his children, so the Lord pitieth them that fear him" (103:3).

In the Bible the term "the fatherless" describes those of utter helplessness. When a mother died, there was great emotional loss, but a child still had a home and support, still had authority and protection. Not so with a child who lost his father.

The Settling Factor

Somebody says, "Well, we have different kinds of churches. You have a soul-winning church, and we have a deeper-life church." In the first place, it's a lie. There's no life as deep as a soul-winning life. However, they say, "We just have different kinds of churches." No, we don't. We have a church, and you don't! Brother, the Bible is our charter to exist. If the Bible is not your final authority in practice and doctrine, then you are not a church. You might have the word "church" on the outside, but you are not a church.

Since the Word of God is our authority,—hear me carefully— we simply must have it. That's a profound statement. We've got to have it! I mean, shall we have

an authority we can't find? Would God tell us His Word is the final authority and leave us without His Word? We must have a copy or we may as well join our Catholic friends and let the church be the basis for truth. If we have no Word of God, and if the Bible is not the Word of God, then we have only three other alternatives. We've got to say the final authority will be the church, or human experience, or human reasoning.

I'm saying, if we have no Bible that is the Word of God, then we have no way to go to the Book for the final authority. If one word in this Bible is not true, we don't know which one it is; so, once again, the mind of man or experience or the church is going to have to decide which one is true and which one is not true. If we are going to believe that the Word of God is the final authority, we've got to have a copy of it.

Let me ask you a question. Would God call a man to preach His Word and not give it to him? God calls a man and says, "I'm calling you. Spend your life preaching the Gospel. Preach the Word!" So, wouldn't He give him a copy of His Word?

Be There

Exodus 24:12, "And the Lord said unto Moses, Come up to me into the mount, and be there"

Why did God say "Come up to me...and be there..."? Once Moses was there, he would "be there." That statement does not make sense to me. Once He had told Moses to come up to the mount, why did He tell Moses to "be there'?

God is saying, "Moses, come up into the mount and bring your mind with you. Do not let your mind be AWOL." God knows human nature. He was telling Moses not to let his mind wander. God was not content to simply have Moses' physical presence; he wanted Moses' mind too. Thus, God added, "Moses when you get there, 'be there'." One of the great secrets to life is found in this verse, "...Come up to me and be there."

Husbands, "Be There"

When husbands are at home, they should "be there." That is not the time to be hiding behind a newspaper or parked in front of the television. Many men who say they are home every night are not telling the truth. A man may be there physically, but if he is not there mentally, he is not there. If a husband would take time to hug his wife, talk to his wife, and whisper sweet nothings in her ear, she may thaw out. That iceberg you have for a wife can be thawed out if you will "be there" while you are there.

Wives, "Be There"

Lest We Forget



Master Sergeant Roddie Edmonds

Roderick W. Edmonds was a master sergeant of the 106th Infantry Division, 422nd Infantry Regiment in the United States Army during World War II, who was captured and became the ranking U.S. non-commissioned officer at the Stalag IX-A prisoner-of-war camp in Germany, where—at the risk of his life—he saved an estimated 200–300 Jews from being singled out from the camp for Nazi persecution and possible death. On their first day in Stalag IX-A, January 27, 1945—as Germany's defeat was clearly approaching—Commandant Siegmann ordered Edmonds to tell only the Jewish-American soldiers to present themselves at the next morning's assembly so they could be separated from the other prisoners.

Instead, Edmonds ordered all 1,275 POWs to assemble outside their barracks. The German commandant rushed up to Edmonds in a fury, placed his pistol against Edmonds's head and demanded that he identify the Jewish soldiers under his command.

Instead, Edmonds responded, "We are all Jews here," and told the commandant that if he wanted to shoot the Jews he would have to shoot all of the prisoners. He then warned the commandant that if he harmed any of Edmonds' men, the commandant would be prosecuted for war crimes after the conflict ended. The commandant backed down. Edmonds' actions are credited with saving up to 300 Jewish-American soldiers from possible death. After 100 days of captivity, Edmonds returned home after the war, but kept the event at the POW camp to himself. He died in 1985, never having received any official recognition, citation or medal for his defense of the Jewish POWs.

His son, Chris Edmonds, a Baptist minister, began researching his story from his father's diaries, and stumbled upon a mention of the event at the POW camp. He located several of the Jewish soldiers his father saved, who provided witness statements to Yad Vashem. Among the Jewish-American POW servicemen who were saved was Sonny Fox, an American television host and executive, who witnessed and later recounted Edmonds' actions.

For his defense of Jewish servicemen at the POW camp, Edmonds, a Christian, was awarded the title "Righteous Among the Nations", Israel's highest award for non-Jews who risked their own lives to save Jews during the Holocaust.
