Don't Let The Devil Have Your Kids

"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."—Prov. 22:6.

It is a shocking thing that Christian parents often utterly fail in rearing godly children.

Whence come all the "new generation," the "revolutionaries," the demonstrators, the draft-card burners, the drug "honkies," the rock-'n'-roll generation, the school dropouts and rebels? Whence come the girls pregnant before marriage, the young people in premarital sex in college dormitories and parked cars, at the seaside or in apartments? Shockingly, they come, many of them, not only from respectable, moral homes, middle class and even luxurious homes, but often from homes of

Christian parents. Why?

A man forty years old was converted in the rescue mission in Evansville, Indiana. He told me he was the son of a godly Methodist preacher. A famous missionary wept in the presence of my brother about his unsaved, unbelieving, skeptical son and daughter. One of the greatest fundamental leaders in America wept as he heard me preach on <u>Lot</u> and <u>The Ruin of a Christian</u>, and he told me later, "If my home had been what it ought to be, surely my children would be serving the Lord. They are not."

The arrest of Billy Sunday's sons for drunkenness was a recurring scandal. The gifted son of a great Southern Christian leader showed much promise, with a sweet singing voice and earnest preaching. But in a seminary he came to not believe the Bible, he began smoking, he attended the movies, and then eventually he gave up all plans to preach the Gospel and serve God.

A famous Bible teacher, with seven or eight children, was brokenhearted that only one of them nominally served the Lord.

Karl Marx, of a Jewish family, was baptized as a Protestant. Joseph Stalin was educated in a religious seminary and was intended for the priesthood.

When I have preached in jails all over America, I have found men who insisted their parents were devout Baptists or Methodists or Presbyterians or Pentecostal people or Catholics. To a shocking degree, the rebels, the immoral, even the criminals, come from homes of Christian parents. That is shameful but true.

Is the so-called "generation gap" inevitable? Must parents lose communication and control over their children? No, they need not! The plain promise of God's Word in *Proverbs 22:6* is, "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it."

This is a chalk drawing of Captain Patrick Ferguson, at the battle of Brandywine Creek during the Revolutionary War.

Patrick was a remarkable man. He was born in Scotland. His father was a lawyer and judge and his brother was a member of Parliament. When he was just 15, he joined the Royal British Dragoons rising to the rank of captain by the time of the Revolutionary War.

One of the great accomplishments of Captain Ferguson is his invention of the most accurate sniper rifle of its day, the Ferguson rifle. It could fire six

rounds in a minute and hit a bull's-eye at 300 yards.

What this man is remembered for more than his invention was his honor. During the battle of Brandywine Creek, Captain Ferguson and a team of his snipers spotted George Washington and another of his ranking officers. His men started to fire, but he ordered them to let them go. Why? Because he said, "I refuse to shoot even my enemy in the back."

The Disciple Whom Jesus Loved

Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved, he

saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own home. (John 19:25-27) John had a relationship with the Lord unlike anyone else. The bond between Jesus and John was not common to every other disciple or to every other man, for that matter. Often, Jesus would leave the disciples and take only a few of them with him; John was always selected as part of that inner circle. It is clear that John, the beloved disciple, had a unique



relationship with Jesus. Of all the disciples, John was the one who was standing by Jesus' mother. John put himself

at great risk as a follower of Christ to be there with Mary that day witnessing Jesus' Crucifixion. This was a most serious hour. This was the direct of circumstances in the lives of those men who followed Christ. John had forsaken all to follow Him; and now the One Whom he loved, the One to Whom he had listened, the One for Whom he had great affection was being crucified. Scripture tells us Jesus was not recognizable as a man. The sight of the Messiah in that state must have been very difficult for John, yet when Jesus addressed His mother, there was the disciple whom He loved standing by Mary. Jesus fulfilled His earthly responsibility as a Son when He spoke to His mother and acknowledged that He had passed the responsibility of her care on to the Apostle John. From the Cross, He spoke to John, "Behold thy mother!" Mary was a widow by this time and had nobody to care for her. Although Jesus was the Son of God, Mary was the human instrument by which God brought Jesus into this world. Jesus did not outgrow the responsibility of caring for His mother. He told her that John would be caring for her now. John always seemed to position himself close to Jesus. Scripture tells us there were times he leaned on the Lord. John loved Jesus and had forsaken everything for Him.

1/4 cup olive oil 8 cloves garlic, finely chopped 1/2 tsp. dried oregano, crushed 1/4 tsp. crushed red pepper 28 oz. can tomato puree

Mozzarella Lasagna

28 oz. can petite-diced tomatoes, drained 4 oz. Parmigiano-Reggiano

4 oz. Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese, grated (1 cup)

8 oz. smoked mozzarella cheese, shredded (2 cups)

8 oz. mozzarella cheese, shredded (2 cups)

12 oz. Tuscan kale, stems removed, coarsely chopped Freshly ground black pepper 3 tbsp. heavy cream

1/2 tsp. sugar 1 large egg

1 tsp. lemon zest

1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt, divided

2 tbsp. dry white wine

1 15 oz. container whole-milk

ricotta 12 no-boil lasagna noodles

Covering the lasagna with oiled foil is key to retaining enough moisture to fully cook the no-boil noodles. But removing it at the end is key, too, to brown the tops and edges.

- 1. For marinara: In a 4- to 5-quart Dutch oven, heat oil and garlic over medium. Cook garlic gently until fragrant but not colored, 3 to 4 minutes. Add oregano and crushed red pepper; cook and stir 1 minute. Add wine; increase heat to medium-high. Cook and stir 1 minute. Add diced tomatoes, tomato puree, 1/2 tsp. salt, the sugar and black pepper to taste. Bring to a boil; reduce heat. Simmer 5 minutes to blend flavors. Stir in cream; cook 2 minutes more.
- 2. For ricotta filling: Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add kale; cook until tender, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain well and spread in a single layer on a large, paper towel-lined baking sheet. Blot with several layers of paper towel to remove excess water.
- 3. In a medium bowl, whisk together egg, lemon zest, 1 teaspoon salt and additional black pepper to taste. Stir in ricotta, Parmigiano-Reggiano and kale.
- 4. In a separate bowl, toss the mozzarellas together to combine.
- 5. Preheat oven to 375°. Spread 1/4 cup marinara over the bottom of a 3-qt. rectangular baking dish. Arrange three lasagna noodles over marinara, leaving a bit of space between them. Divide one-third of the ricotta filling among noodles, spreading to cover noodles. Sprinkle 1 cup of the mozzarellas evenly over ricotta filling. Top with 1 cup marinara. Repeat layers two more times. For the final layer, add the last three noodles on top; cover completely with the remaining sauce.
- 6. Brush a large sheet of foil with olive oil. Place foil, oiled-side down, over baking dish and cover tightly. Bake 15 minutes. Remove foil; sprinkle remaining mozzarella over top. Bake until lasagna is browned and bubbling at edges, 25 to 30 minutes more. Let stand at least 10 minutes before serving. If you like, sprinkle with additional Parmigiano-Reggiano.

JOE BIDEN WANTS TO BAN CHRISTIAN FAMILIES FROM ADOPTING CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

Joe Biden wants to essentially ban Christians from adopting foster care children based on their religious beliefs and opposition to radical LGBTQ ideology. U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has proposed a new rule that would prohibit families who do not support LGBTQ ideology from caring for foster children.

The United States Administration for Children and Families (ACF), a division within HHS, proposed that foster families meet three specific criteria to ensure that LGBTQ-identifying children are in a "safe" and "nurturing" home.

Those criteria essentially force Christian parents to affirm a child's pretend gender as opposed to supporting children truthfully based on their biological sex and providing them appropriate support and resources to move away from the radical leftist ideology that pushes hormones, sex changes and mutilation of children to conform to its extreme sexual agenda.

"Responding to the radical proposal, 19 Republican attorneys general are pushing the Biden administration to back down on a new rule they say will effectively exclude Christian families from fostering kids and jeopardize the foster care system nationwide," Fox News reports.

In addition to discriminating against religion, the attorneys general argue that the proposed rule "will harm children by limiting the number of available foster homes, harm families by risking kinship placements, and harm states by increasing costs and decreasing care options."

3900 British women hospitalized after botched abortions in 2021

At least 3900 women were admitted to hospitals in England during 2021 due to complications following a surgical abortion.

During November 2023, the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) published new statistics, reporting the rate of complications arising from abortions in England.

According to the OHID, in 2021 there were 19.3 hospital admissions for complications related to incomplete abortions per 1000 abortions conducted in England for residents. Government data indicates a total of 203,662 abortions in England that year. This suggest that at least 3900 women may have been admitted to NHS hospitals in England, due to complications arising from incomplete abortions.
