## Marks of a Thankful Christian

**INTRODUCTION:** Just like there are certain characteristics of a soldier, carpenter, sales man, preacher, singer, ball player; there are genuine marks of a thankful Christian.

Here are just a few marks of a thankful Christian.

## FIRST: WALKS IN THE LIGHT.

<u> I JOHN 1:6-7</u>

Notice that the verse does not say that "We walk in the light as He is IN the light." We are, therefore, commanded to walk in partnership with Him; to walk as He walks.

SECOND: OBEDIENT TO GOD'S WORD.

I JOHN 2:4,5; 3:24

Sinners are never invited to accept Jesus as Saviour, but to accept him as LORD and Saviour; the Lord Jesus Christ; Jesus Christ the Lord, Jesus said in Luke 6:46, "... Why call ye me Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" A true servant cannot say, "Not so Lord."

## THIRD: DOESN'T HATE HIS BROTHER.

I JOHN 2:9-11; 3:15; 4:20

Jesus hated sin, but loved the sinner; so these verses are not directed against hating wicked deeds, but against hating the individual. Christians who allow themselves to be so bitter in their condemnation of one another as to actually hate them, are not walking in the light as He is in the light. Think of Jesus bitterly hating anyone.

## FOURTH: IS NOT CONSUMED BY THE WORLD

I JOHN 2:15

The expression used here, "the world" refers to what we would call "worldliness." If there is any doubt as to the propriety of doing anything: try to place the Lord Jesus in that position. If He looks out of place, it is wrong.

## FIFTH: BELIEVES IN THE DEITY OF CHRIST.

I JOHN 2:22: 4:3

The word "Divinity" means "proceeding from God," while the word "Deity" can only be applied to God Himself: therefore, Jesus was, is, and always will be "God."

## SIXTH: DOES NOT PRACTICE SIN.

I JOHN 3:4-10; 5:18

Other versions of this verse use such words as "habitually sin," or "who make a practice of sin." Since committing sin is disobedience, the practice of sin is

## 1621 FIRST THANKSGIVING CHEESECAKE

1 cup graham cracker crumbs 1 cup sugar

4 pkg. (8 oz. each) Philadelphia Cream Cheese, softened

2 tbsp. sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

4 eggs

Heat oven to 325°F. Combine graham crumbs, butter and 2 Tbsp. sugar; press onto bottom of 10-inch cast-iron skillet sprayed with cooking spray. Beat cream

1/4 cup butter, melted

cheese with vanilla and remaining sugar in large bowl with mixer until blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing on low speed after each just until blended. Pour over crust. (Note: Pan will be very full.) Place pan on baking sheet, then place in oven. Bake 50 to 55 min. or until center of cheesecake is almost set. Cool completely. Refrigerate 4 hours.

Special Extra: Garnish finished cheesecake with nuts, and regional Thanksgiving fruits, such as cranberries, grapes, figs, blueberries, and/or raspberries.

## Faith of a Father Hebrews 11:1-7

The Bible says that Noah was warned of God of things not seen as yet. In *Hebrews 11:1*, we are told that the definition of faith includes the evidence of things not seen. God's commands, not our sight, should determine our actions. Often, we must obey God even though we cannot see the benefit of following God's Word. So much of the Christian life is based upon living and doing that which we cannot comprehend by sight. What makes faith to be faith is that we do it without sight. In essence, all of the characters we read about in this chapter obeyed God based upon faith, without evidence of what they had yet seen. Our tendency is to obey God when we can see the end result, but that is not true faith. Noah had never seen a flood and, most likely, had never seen rainfall. Yet, he obeyed God based upon His Word, not upon what he had seen.

The Bible says that he moved with fear. We may assume that it was a flood that he feared. However, he had never seen a flood so that cannot be the case. We often fear what we know is dangerous or can harm us. Noah had no source of reference to give him fear regarding a flood. Noah's fear was of God, not of a flood. Far too often our faith is based upon our fear of circumstances, but that is not faith. Faith is when we obey God because we know that He is holy and righteous. It is not a fear of terror. It is a fear because we know that God is great and mighty. It is a reverential respect for the power and might of God. Noah performed the task assigned to him with great haste because of his fear of God within, not the fear of flood without.

The Bible says that he prepared an ark to the saving of his house. It was not merely an act of saving his own life. Noah, by faith, obeyed God for the sake of his own family. Far too often we do not consider our families when we make decisions. People who live by faith typically are people who do so, not as an act of self-service, but for the purpose of the benefits it brings to their families. Men of faith understand the importance of doing what they do for the sake of sparing their own families. People who do not live by faith do not take into consideration the consequences that can come to their families as a result of their faithlessness.

## SEVENTH: WILL NOT DOUBT GOD'S WORD.

I JOHN 5:9-11

The assurance of our salvation is not to be based upon "feelings," or upon "experience," but upon the promise of God. If I meet the conditions, I have no doubt in my mind but what a letter will be delivered to its assigned destination.

THAT I will endeavor in my conduct and deportment before the world and my fellow servants especially to conduct myself as a humble, meek and zealous follower of the bleeding Lamb, and by serious conversation and warning endeavor to lead them to think of their immortal souls.

THAT I will read no less than four chapters in God's Word every day.

THAT I will strive to live closer to God, and to seek after holiness of heart and leave providential events with God.

THAT I will read this over every day or at least twice a week.

God help me, enable me to cultivate a spirit of self denial and to yield myself a prisoner of love to the Redeemer of the world. Amen and Amen.
