Mother's Day

II Kings 20:15

<u>Introduction:</u> In *II Kings 20:15*, the Man of God, Isaiah, asks King Hezekiah a very convicting question: "What have they seen in thine house?"

This question should convict all of us, but especially mom.

Our text has it's setting in Old Testament history. Hezekiah, the king, has been seriously ill. He turned his face to the wall and prayed for God to give him more time in which to perform the duties of a

king.

I contend that just as he asked of the leader about his home, so also the question applies to every mother. **Mom! What have they seen in your home?**

FIRST: THEY SHOULD SEE CHRIST.

MARK 2:1

I have been in homes where they had a motto on the wall which reads as follows: "Christ is the head of this home, the unseen Guest at every meal, the silent listener to every conversation."

"... he was in the house." The 'he' speaks of Jesus.

SECOND: THEY SHOULD SEE LOVE.

I JOHN 4:7

The home should be founded in love. The children should be born in love. Love should abound in every area of home life. Yes, love and companionship and sweet-fellowship should prevail in every home.

"Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God..."

THIRD: THEY SHOULD SEE THE BIBLE.

LUKE 10:38-39

This great Book should not be on the shelf gathering dust or on a table where it is never used. Your children should see it in your hands and they should hear its stories from your lips. Yes, they ought to see the Bible and hear it read in your home.

"Martha received him into her house ... Mary ... heard his word."

FOURTH: THEY SHOULD SEE PRAYER.

ACTS 12:12

I am amazed to learn that some people do not even ask the blessing at meal time. I have seen pigs eating nuts under a tree, but they never look up to see where the nuts came from.

But I cannot imagine people sitting down to eat three times a day and not thanking God Who gave them their food.

FIFTH: THEY SHOULD SEE DISCIPLINE.

ROVERRS 20.1

By discipline I do not mean cruelty, but I do mean loving correction. When you see a child who does not know how to behave in church or in Sunday School or in public, you

The Making Of A Legend

On April 19, 1775, British forces were returning to Boston from the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the opening engagements of the war. On their march they were continually shot at by American militiamen.

Samuel Whittemore was in his fields when he spotted an approaching British relief brigade under Earl Percy, sent to assist the retreat. Whittemore loaded his word Whitemen - 907 73 on Join 18 7 7725 When I Sort I Sort I White I Sort I So

musket and ambushed the British grenadiers of the 47th Regiment from behind a nearby stone wall, killing one soldier. He then drew his dueling pistols, killed a second grenadier and mortally wounded a third. By the time Whittemore had fired his third shot, a British detachment had reached his position; Whittemore drew his sword and attacked. He was subsequently shot in the face, bayoneted numerous times, and left for dead in a pool of blood. He was found

by colonial forces, trying to load his musket to resume the fight. He was taken to Dr. Cotton Tufts of Medford, who perceived no hope for his survival. However, Whittemore recovered and lived another 18 years until dying of natural causes at the age of 98.





"I thank God... When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also." II Tim. 1:3,5.

Paul could thank God for Timothy's faith and his wonderful life and ministry, and so he could thank God for the grandmother Lois and the mother Eunice, who had taught Timothy to know and love the Saviour. Oh, we ought to thank God far good mothers!

Of the Ten Commandments, four of them have to do with our relation to God, and the last six, with our relationship to mankind. But the first of these six is, 'Honour thy father and thy mother; that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee." (Exod. 20:12). And we are reminded in Ephesians

6:2 that this is the first commandment with promise.

The wife shares with her husband that marvelous privilege of bringing an immortal soul into being, in conception. The husband and wife are, "heirs together of the grace of life." (I Peter 3:7). Is it at the moment of conception, as we think, or at the time of quickening, or at the actual birth, that the child becomes an immortal soul?' I think at the moment of conception. Exodus 21:15,17 says, "And he that smiteth his father, or his mother, shall be surely put to death. And he that curseth his father, or his mother, shall surely be put to death."

A godly reverence is required of children for their parents, and the mother in this, at least, is equal to the father.

Origins

Founded in 1916, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, Incorporated, otherwise known as Planned Parenthood, is a nonprofit organization that claims to provide reproductive health care. The organization was created by nurse and birth control activist Margaret Sanger, who originally called it the American Birth Control League.

Now with over 650 clinics throughout the country, celebrity donors, multi-million dollar

ad campaigns, and a nearly \$1 billion net worth, Planned Parenthood has grown into an influential force in the United States. In its messaging, the organization consistently claims to advocate for reproductive freedom, safe sex, bodily autonomy, and women's health.

But is this the reality of Planned Parenthood?

Not a Clean Record

For the past several decades, Planned Parenthood has dedicated their efforts towards cleaning up their public image and "going mainstream." This approach was a calculated one, stemming primarily from a desire for organization with abortion—a difficult task, considering this is what Planned Parenthood has always been most well-known for.
