### We Have An Altar

Hebrews 13:10

**INTRODUCTION:** The word *altar* is found over 400 times in the Bible, which is a good indication that the Lord had attached some significant importance to it. An altar was erected and used in the Bible for a variety of reasons. (1) The altar was designed to be a place of sacrifice! (2) The altar was designed by God to be a place of death! Every sacrifice that was to be placed upon it was to be put to death first. (3) The altar was also to be a place of devotion! It was at an altar that God's people made some very significant and life-changing decisions.

### FIRST: NOAH BUILT AN ALTAR OF THANKSGIVING.

(GENESIS 8:15-20)

Noah's life and the lives of his family had been spared by a worldwide flood that killed every living person.

- He had preached to his neighbors and friends for 120 years and yet they mocked and ignored his pleadings of a coming judgment.
- For months, his family had drifted in the ark, not knowing what the future held and finally the ark came to rest on dry ground.
- When Noah stepped off the ark, he was probably humbled at the idea that God had destroyed the entire human race except for his family.
- 4. Therefore, he built an altar to express an overflowing heart of thanksgiving!

One of the wisest things that a Christian can do in order to continue God's blessings in their life is to take the time to express heart-felt gratitude and love for what God has done in their life.

#### SECOND: ABRAHAM BUILT AN ALTAR OF FAITH.

(<u>GENESIS 22:6-12)</u>

Most people think of Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son Isaac as being an amazing story of obedience. Actually, it's an even better example - one of the best in the Bible - concerning faith! It was his faith that enabled him to do the unthinkable and obey the Lord's command to sacrifice his son. So what was the object of his faith?

- Abraham believed God when He told him thet He would give him a son! And he believed him even further when God told him that he would use that son to produce a nation and people that would be so big that they would be innumerable, as the grains of sand in every beach, seacoast and desert in the world.
- 2. Therefore, while God's command didn't make sense to Abraham. he chose to believe that if God was going to have him sacrifice his son. God would then raise his son from the dead and give him back to him!
- 3. It was Abraham's willingness to take God at His word and cling to the promises of God that allowed him to exercise such stunning obedience and amazing faith!

#### THIRD: ISAAC BUILT AN ALTAR OF PROTECTION. (GENESIS 26:20-28)

Isaac ran into some major problems when it came to trying to find a suitable place to live. In the arid region where he lived, a well was life and death. It would seem that the Lord gave him wisdom and discernment in finding wells. The problem was that every time he dug a well, it was stolen from him!

 After he had moved again because of potential bloodshed. Isaac was approached by the Lord and told to "fear not."

#### THE BLOOD OF CHRIST

Romans 5:8-9

Listen to me, folks. If that blood had just been left at the altar, not a single Jew would have had one sin forgiven. It's not the blood at the foot of the altar; it's the blood on the mercy seat. So, it isn't just the fact that the bullock died. If the bullock had died and shed his blood, that would not have forgiven one sin, but that blood had to be taken by the high priest inside the holy of holies and sprinkled seven times on the mercy seat. The same blood that was shed out there on the altar is now sprinkled here on this mercy seat. When God saw it, God said, "Sin is atoned for!" and the day of atonement was over.

Now follow me carefully. The Bible says Jesus was our what? Passover. What else was he? Atonement. When John the Baptist pointed to Jesus, he said, "Behold the lamb of God." So what was he? He was our sacrifice on this altar out here. This is a picture of Calvary.

However, ladies and gentlemen, the blood on this altar out here will not get us to Heaven. The blood has got to get to the heavenly mercy seat. The Bible says that the earthly tabernacle was a type of the heavenly tabernacle. Just as the blood of that lamb had to get in there on the holy of holies mercy seat, even so the real blood of the real Lamb must get to the real mercy seat in the real presence of God. Brother, if the blood of Jesus Christ, God's Son, is not sprinkled on the mercy seat in the glory world, you and I are of all men most miserable. That's the only hope we've got.

Follow me carefully. Jesus was our lamb. Now let's go back to *I Corinthians 15:1-4*. What's the Gospel? The death, burial and resurrection of Christ. That's the Gospel -death, burial and resurrection - so we have to have all three in our passover and all three in our atonement. If Christ is our atonement, He has to die. Jesus was two things for us: He was our sacrifice Who shed His blood, and He was our High Priest Who took His blood into the presence of God Himself.

#### The Helmet Of Salvation Ephesians 6:17

As it was necessary to protect other parts of the body while in battle, it was essential for a soldier to protect his head. If detail was taken in protecting the feet which, in comparison, is not as important as the head, it makes sense to give attention to this crucial part of the body. A soldier's helmet was essential for two reasons.

First, it protected him from head injuries. Head injuries were often fatal. The sword of an enemy had the capacity of inflicting two types of damage. It could deliver a blunt blow to the head, leaving a soldier defenseless and often leading to death. The other edge of the sword was sharp and could be used to sever the head or to wound fatally. For that reason, helmets were constructed of metal and leather. Because of the extreme weight, the helmets

were fitted tightly to a soldier's head. The helmet covered the neck and even some of the soldier's face.

Secondly, it identified him from other soldiers. Different helmets were worn depending on the soldier's position or duty. The helmet distinguished that soldier for his uniqueness. A soldier's helmet was personalized. Soldiers took great pride in customizing their helmets. They uniquely engraved them. Each of us has our own personal experience of coming to faith in Christ. It is our testimony. We must wear it on our heads in a personal way.

I was born to two Christian parents. I have a rich Christian heritage. Both my parents and grandparents have their own unique story of salvation. There came a time in my life when I needed my own personal story of placing my faith in Christ. It was not my grandparents' story. It was not my dad's story. It was not my mom's story. My helmet of salvation is unique to me. It is personalized. No one will be in Heaven who has no personal story of having accepted Christ as his only hope for salvation. Just as the soldier was to put on a unique helmet, we must have our unique helmet of salvation. "And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:" (Ephesians 6:17)

- He had finally arrived at the very place that God had for him and immediately his servants dug another well.
- 3. Abimelech, the same man who had spearheaded the previous attacks on his wells now approached Isaac with an entirely different attitude.
- 4. Instead of coming to fight, he came asking that Isaac would make a covenant with him because he could plainly see that God was with Isaac!
- 5. Notice that Abimelech's change in behavior and attitude came AFTER an altar was built!

### FOURTH: MOSES BUILT AN ALTAR OF WARFARE. (EXODUS 17:12-16)

Amalek led his men to attack the Hebrews as they were journeying through the wilderness, when the Lord told Moses to ascend to the top of a hill and assure the victory of his people by holding his rod above his head. Eventually Aaron and Hur came to help and Amalek was finally defeated.

- 1. Following this victory, the Lord revealed something to Moses that every Christian needs to learn.
- 2. The battle was over but the war would continue!
- Amalek had been defeated, but would remain as the enemy of God and His people, and would return for battle after battle.
- 4. What does that have to do with us?
- 5. Amalek is a type of the flesh! The flesh may be subdued but it will never be destroyed except through either the rapture or by death!
- When Moses built an altar, he was taking his position as a warrior, willing to constantly wage war against the enemies of God for however long it took.
- 7. To be just as pleasing to the Lord, we too must make a decision (erecting an altar) to constantly wage a war against our flesh!

<u>Conclusion:</u> Every child of God needs an altar where they can go aside and spend time with the Lord. <u>Mark 1:35, "... departed to a solitary place, and there prayed."</u>

Why is it that we do not recognize that the love of God extends to the fallen saved as well as the fallen lost? Why is it that the church seems unable to recognize that Christ loved us so

much that when He saved us, He indwelled us with His Spirit in order to retain possession and ownership? Why is it that when we sin, God does not discard us, does not take back that spirit, and does not withhold the eternal life that He gave us?

Yet, we as a church tend to discredit and disregard that life.

When the Bible speaks of restoration it says, "Ye which are spiritual." In other words, ye who have the spirit within you, and who have a spiritual nature, restore those others who also have a spirit. In other words, if you are spiritual, there is a bond and a love. There is disgust in many of God's people for fallen brethren. It is almost a feeling of contempt. The Bible says, "herein shall ye know that ye are my disciples because you love one another."

The Bible does not say you love one another only when you do not sin. Often there is contempt for saved people who have fallen. The Bible says restore such a one in a spirit of meekness, considering thyself.

#### CHINA'S BACK DOOR INTO OUR MILITARY
